20	of each head of the family in the amount of [two thousand
21	dollars (\$2,000)] twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000). The
22	legislature shall also exempt from taxation the property,
23	including the community or joint property of husband and wife,

1 discharged member of the armed forces of the United States, in 2 the sum of three thousand dollars (\$3,000) in 2004; three 3 thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500) in 2005; and four 4 thousand dollars (\$4,000) in 2006 and each subsequent year. 5 Provided, that in every case where exemption is claimed on the ground of the claimant's having served with the armed forces of 6 7 the United States as aforesaid, the burden of proving actual 8 and bona fide ownership of such property upon which exemption 9 is claimed, shall be upon the claimant." 10 The amendment proposed by this resolution Section 2. 11 shall be submitted to the people for their approval or 12 rejection at the next general election or at any special 13 election prior to that date that may be called for that 14 purpose. 15 - 2 -16 17 18 19 20 21 22 23 24 25 .175591.1
