16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	Section 1. Section 13-4A-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986,
18	Chapter 11, Section 1) is amended to read:
19	"13-4A-1. SHORT TITLE[This act] <u>Chapter 13, Article 4A</u>
20	<u>NMSA 1978</u> may be cited as the "Art in Public Places Act"."
21	Section 2. Section 13-4A-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986,
22	Chapter 11, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
23	"13-4A-3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Art in Public

25	A. "agency" means all state departments and

B. "architect" means the person or firm designing the project for the contracting agency to which the one percent provision pursuant to Section 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 applies;

<u>C. "commission" means the New Mexico arts</u> <u>commission;</u>

[C.] <u>D.</u> "contracting agency" means the agency having the control, management and power to enter into contracts for new construction or renovation of [any] <u>a</u> public building;

[D.] <u>E.</u> "division" means the arts division of the [office of] cultural affairs department;

[E.] <u>F.</u> "public buildings" means those buildings under the control and management of the property control division of the general services department, the department of game and fish, the energy, minerals and natural resources department, the [state highway and] <u>department of</u> transportation [department], the state fair commission, the supreme court, the commissioner of public lands, the [office of] cultural affairs <u>department</u>, the governing boards of the state educational institutions and statutorily created post-secondary educational .180169.1

institutions, the [state department of] public education <u>department</u> and the legislature or all buildings constructed with funds appropriated by the legislature. For the purposes of the Art in Public Places Act, "public buildings" does not include such auxiliary buildings as maintenance plants, correctional facilities, warehouses or temporary structures; and

[F.] G. "work of art" means any work of visual art, including but not limited to a drawing, painting, mural, fresco, sculpture, mosaic or photograph; a work of calligraphy; a work of graphic art, including an etching, lithograph, offset print, silk screen or a work of graphic art of like nature; works in clay, textile, fiber, wood, metal, plastic, glass and like materials; or mixed media, including a collage or assemblage or any combination of the foregoing art media [which] that is chosen to be included in or immediately adjoining the <u>public</u> building under consideration. Under special circumstances, the term may include environmental landscaping if approved by the [division] commission."

Section 3. Section 13-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 11, Section 4) is amended to read:

"13-4A-4. ALLOCATION OF CONSTRUCTION COSTS.--

A. All agencies shall allocate as a nondeductible item an amount of money equal to one percent or two hundred thousand dollars (200,000), whichever is less, of the amount of money appropriated for new construction, or any major .180169.1 - 3 -

renovation exceeding one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), to be expended for the acquisition and installation of works of art for the new <u>public</u> building to be constructed or the <u>public</u> building in which the major renovation is to occur.

Β. An amount of money equal to one percent or two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000), whichever is less, allocated from appropriations for new construction or major renovations of excluded structures pursuant to Subsection $[\frac{E}{2}]$ of Section [3 of the Art in Public Places Act] 13-4A-3 NMSA 1978 shall be accounted for separately and expended for acquisition and installation of art for existing public The [division] commission shall determine the buildings. amount, not to exceed fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000), to be made available for the purchase of art in existing public buildings in consultation with the [contracting agency] agencies that have control over the existing public buildings. The selection process for art for existing public buildings shall follow guidelines established by the [division] commission pursuant to the Art in Public Places Act."

Section 4. Section 13-4A-7 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1986, Chapter 11, Section 7) is amended to read:

"13-4A-7. ADMINISTRATION OF THE PROGRAM.--The [division] commission shall determine the amount to be made available for the purchase of art, in consultation with the contracting agency responsible for the <u>public</u> building to be constructed or .180169.1

1 renovated, and payments [thereof] shall be made in accordance 2 with law. All agencies shall notify the division in writing 3 upon legislative approval of construction budgets. One percent 4 of the total appropriation for new construction or renovation 5 of any public building shall be deposited into the art in public places fund after the issuance of the appropriate bonds. 6 7 If the entire one percent of the total funds appropriated for a 8 particular <u>public</u> building is not required for the project, the 9 remainder shall accumulate in the art in public places fund and 10 shall be accounted for separately and expended for the 11 acquisition of art for existing public buildings, as determined 12 by the [division] commission. Any money remaining in the fund 13 at the end of each fiscal year shall not revert but shall 14 remain in the art in public places fund to be used to implement 15 the purposes of the Art in Public Places Act."

"13-4A-8. ARTIST SELECTION.--The [division] commission shall establish guidelines for the art selection process. This process shall provide for participation from representatives of the contracting agency, the user agency, <u>the commission</u>, the division, the project architect, visual artists or design professionals and interested members of the community."

B. The commission is composed of fifteen members appointed by the governor <u>with the consent of the senate</u>. Members shall be broadly representative of all fields of the .180169.1

1 creative and interpretative arts.

C. Members of the commission shall be residents of this state and shall be persons who are widely known for their professional competence and experience in connection with the creative or interpretive arts.

Members of the commission shall initially be 6 D. 7 appointed for terms as follows: five members shall be 8 appointed for terms of one year, five members shall be 9 appointed for terms of two years and five members shall be 10 appointed for terms of three years. The first members of the 11 commission shall be appointed on or before September 1, 1965, 12 with the date of office of all these members to commence on the 13 same day. After the expiration of the initial terms, all 14 members shall be appointed for terms of three years. Vacancies 15 resulting from the death or resignation of a member shall be 16 filled by appointment for the unexpired portion of the term of 17 the member creating the vacancy.

E. Members of the commission [shall] are entitled to receive per diem and mileage as provided for nonsalaried public employees in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance."

"18-5-5. COMMISSION--DUTIES.--
