15	SECTION 1. Laws 2010, Chapter 101, Section 1 is amended
16	to read:
17	"Section 1. TEMPORARY PROVISIONGOVERNMENT RESTRUCTURING
18	TASK FORCE CREATEDThe "government restructuring task force"
19	is created. The task force shall function from the date of its
20	appointment until December 31, [2010] <u>2011</u> ."
21	SECTION 2. Laws 2010, Chapter 101, Section 2 is amended
22	to read:
23	"Section 2. TEMPORARY PROVISIONMEMBERSHIP
24	APPOINTMENTVACANCIES
25	A. The government restructuring task force shall be
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composed of [seventeen] eighteen voting members. Five members of the house of representatives shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives, and five members of the senate shall be appointed by the committees' committee of the senate or, if the appointments are made in the interim, by the president pro tempore of the senate after consultation with and agreement of a majority of the members of the committees' committee.

B. Members of the government restructuring task force shall be appointed from each house so as to give the two major political parties in each house the same proportional representation on the task force as prevails in each house. Vacancies on the task force shall be filled by appointment in the same manner as the original appointments. The chair and vice chair of the task force shall be elected by the task force.

C. Six public members with expertise in public and private sector organizational structure and operations shall be appointed to the task force, three of whom shall be appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives and three of whom shall be appointed by the president pro tempore of the senate. The public members shall reflect the ethnic, cultural and geographic diversity of the state.

D. The secretary of finance and administration <u>and</u> <u>a member of the governor's staff</u> shall be [a member] <u>members</u> of .183439.1

The task force shall meet at the call of the 2 Ε. 3 chair as necessary to carry out its duties, but no less than once and no more than twice a month. The first meeting of 2011 4 5 shall be held no later than April 22, [2010] 2011. F. Three absences from meetings of the task force 6 7 shall constitute grounds for removal of a member of the task Upon the request of the chair of the task force, the 8 force. 9 appointing authority shall replace the member who has failed to attend three meetings of the task force. 10 G. A majority of the members constitutes a quorum 11 12 for the transaction of business. The support of a majority of the members is required for adoption of any action by the task 13 force; provided, however, that the final report of the task 14 force, including its recommendations and proposed legislation, 15

must have the support of a majority of the legislative members."

SECTION 3. Laws 2010, Chapter 101, Section 3 is amended to read:

"Section 3. TEMPORARY PROVISION--DUTIES.--

A. After its appointment, the government restructuring task force shall hold one organizational meeting to develop a work plan and budget for the ensuing interim.

B. The government restructuring task force shall study the current resources of the state's agencies, programs, .183439.1

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1 services, funding and policies and the public needs served by 2 them, including the: recommendations [of] from the [governor's 3 (1)committee] first year of the task force and from any committees 4 on government efficiency appointed by the governor; 5 need for continued consolidation of 6 (2) 7 agencies and elimination or reduction of redundant, duplicative or overlapping programs or services; 8 9 (3) current and projected staffing needs of state agencies for full-time, part-time, term, temporary and 10 contract employment; [and] 11 12 (4) current and projected revenue estimates for the next three to five fiscal years; 13 (5) further scrutiny of cost-savings and 14 efficiencies in the judicial and legislative branches; 15 (6) monitoring of the higher education funding 16 formula task force's work to redesign that formula; 17 (7) monitoring of public school and higher 18 education implementation of articulation and credit 19 20 transferability statutes and performance of college freshmen from New Mexico high schools; and 21 (8) monitoring of executive reorganizations. 22 C. The government restructuring task force shall 23 solicit public input. 24 [D. The government restructuring task force shall 25 .183439.1 - 4 -

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study the recommendations, initiatives and statutory changes that occurred between 1975 and 1978 in reorganizing state government.

E.] D. The government restructuring task force shall examine the statutes, constitutional provisions, rules and court decisions governing state government and reorganization and recommend legislation or changes.

 $[F_{\bullet}]$ E. The department of finance and administration and the various agencies of the state shall cooperate with the task force and provide the task force with 10 information regarding budget, staffing, organizational 12 structure and other information as requested by the task force."

SECTION 4. [NEW MATERIAL] TEMPORARY PROVISION--SUBCOMMITTEES.--Subcommittees shall be created only by majority vote of all members appointed to the government restructuring task force. A subcommittee shall be composed of at least one member from the senate and one member from the house of representatives, and at least one member of the minority party shall be a member of the subcommittee. All meetings and expenditures of a subcommittee shall be approved by the full task force in advance of such meeting or expenditure, and the approval shall be shown in the minutes of the task force.

SECTION 5. Laws 2010, Chapter 101, Section 5 is amended to read:

10	SECTION 6. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] TEMPORARY PROVISIONSTAFF
11	The staff for the government restructuring task force shall be
12	provided by the legislative council service, the legislative
13	finance committee, the legislative education study committee
14	and the department of finance and administration.
15	SECTION 7. EMERGENCYIt is necessary for the public
16	peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.
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
