SECTION 2. TEMPORARY PROVISION--DISTRICT JUDGE--APPOINTMENT. -- The additional district judgeship provided for in this act shall be filled by appointment by the governor pursuant to the provisions of Article 6 of the constitution of New Mexico.

APPROPRIATION. -- Four hundred twenty-three thousand eighty-seven dollars (\$423,087) is appropriated from the general fund to the eighth judicial district for expenditure in fiscal year 2012 for salaries and benefits and furniture, supplies and equipment for one additional district judge and support staff. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2012 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2011.
