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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 22-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
19	Chapter 153, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"22-1-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Public School Code:
21	A. "academic proficiency" means mastery of the

24	B. "adequate yearly progress" means the measure

"home school" means the operation by the parent Ε. of a school-age person of a home study program of instruction that provides a basic academic educational program, including reading, language arts, mathematics, social studies and science;

"instructional support provider" means a person F. who is employed to support the instructional program of a school district, including educational assistant, school counselor, social worker, school nurse, speech-language pathologist, psychologist, physical therapist, occupational therapist, recreational therapist, marriage and family therapist, interpreter for the deaf and diagnostician;

"licensed school employee" means teachers, G. school administrators and instructional support providers;

"local school board" means the policy-setting н. body of a school district;

"local superintendent" means the chief executive I. officer of a school district;

"parent" includes a guardian or other person J. .185673.1 - 2 -

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having custody and control of a school-age person;

"private school" means a school, other than a Κ. home school, that offers on-site programs of instruction and that is not under the control, supervision or management of a local school board;

"public school" means that part of a school L. district that is a single attendance center in which instruction is offered by one or more teachers and is discernible as a building or group of buildings generally recognized as either an elementary, middle, junior high or high school or any combination of those and includes a charter school;

"school" means a supervised program of Μ. instruction designed to educate a student in a particular place, manner and subject area;

"school administrator" means a person licensed N. to administer in a school district and includes school principals and central district administrators;

"school-age person" means a person who is at 0. least five years of age [prior to 12:01 a.m.] on September 1 of the school year and who has not received a high school diploma or its equivalent. A maximum age of twenty-one shall be used for a person who is classified as special education membership as defined in Section 22-8-21 NMSA 1978 or as a resident of a state institution;

X. "state educational institution" means an institution enumerated in Article 12, Section 11 of the constitution of New Mexico;

Y. "substitute teacher" means a person who holds a certificate to substitute for a teacher in the classroom;

Z. "teacher" means a person who holds a level one, two or three-A license and whose primary duty is classroom instruction or the supervision, below the school principal level, of an instructional program or whose duties include curriculum development, peer intervention, peer coaching or mentoring or serving as a resource teacher for other teachers;

AA. "certified school instructor" means a teacher or instructional support provider; and

BB. "certified school employee" or "certified school personnel" means a licensed school employee."

SECTION 2. Section 22-8-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1978, Chapter 128, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"22-8-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Public School Finance Act:

A. "ADM" or "MEM" means membership;

B. "membership" means the total enrollment of .185673.1

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1 qualified students on the current roll of a class or school on 2 a specified day. The current roll is established by the 3 addition of original entries and reentries minus withdrawals. 4 Withdrawals of students, in addition to students formally 5 withdrawn from the public school, include students absent from the public school for as many as ten consecutive school days; 6 7 provided that withdrawals do not include students in need of 8 early intervention and habitual truants the school district is 9 required to intervene with and keep in an educational setting as provided in Section 22-12-9 NMSA 1978; 10

C. "basic program ADM" or "basic program MEM" means the MEM of qualified students but excludes the full-timeequivalent MEM in early childhood education and three- and four-year-old students receiving special education services;

D. "cost differential factor" is the numerical expression of the ratio of the cost of a particular segment of the school program to the cost of the basic program in grades four through six;

E. "department" or "division" means the public education department;

F. "early childhood education ADM" or "early childhood education MEM" means the full-time-equivalent MEM of students attending approved early childhood education programs;

G. "full-time-equivalent ADM" or "full-timeequivalent MEM" is that membership calculated by applying to .185673.1

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1 the MEM in an approved public school program the ratio of the 2 number of hours per school day devoted to the program to six 3 hours or the number of hours per school week devoted to the 4 program to thirty hours;

H. "operating budget" means the annual financial plan required to be submitted by a local school board or governing body of a state-chartered charter school;

8 I. "program cost" is the product of the total 9 number of program units to which a school district is entitled 10 multiplied by the dollar value per program unit established by 11 the legislature;

J. "program element" is that component of a public school system to which a cost differential factor is applied to determine the number of program units to which a school district is entitled, including but not limited to MEM, full-time-equivalent MEM, teacher, classroom or public school;

K. "program unit" is the product of the program element multiplied by the applicable cost differential factor;

L. "public money" or "public funds" means all money from public or private sources received by a school district or state-chartered charter school or officer or employee of a school district or state-chartered charter school for public use;

M. "qualified student" means a public school student who:

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1	(1) has not graduated from high school;
2	(2) is regularly enrolled in one-half or more
3	of the minimum course requirements approved by the department
4	for public school students; and
5	(3) in terms of age:
6	(a) is at least five years of age [prior
7	to 12:01 a.m.] on September 1 of the school year;
8	(b) is at least three years of age at
9	any time during the school year and is receiving special
10	education services pursuant to rules of the department; or
11	(c) has not reached the student's
12	twenty-second birthday on the first day of the school year and
13	is receiving special education services pursuant to rules of
14	the department; and
15	N. "state superintendent" means the secretary of
16	public education or the secretary's designee."
17	SECTION 3. Section 32A-23-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2005,
18	Chapter 170, Section 3) is amended to read:

21	A. "community" means an area defined by school
22	district boundaries, tribal boundaries or joint boundaries of a

C. "early childhood development specialist" means the adult responsible for working directly with four-year-old children in implementing pre-kindergarten services;

D. "eligible provider" means a person licensed by the children, youth and families department that provides early childhood developmental readiness services or preschool special education, or is a public school, tribal program or head start program;

E. "pre-kindergarten" means a voluntary developmental readiness program for children who have attained their fourth birthday prior to <u>or on</u> September 1; and

F. "tribe" means an Indian nation, tribe or pueblo located in New Mexico."

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
