11	RELATING TO HEALTH; ENACTING THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE ACT;
12	PROVIDING FOR A PROCESS TO REVIEW THE SCOPE OF PRACTICE FOR
13	CERTAIN LICENSED HEALTH PROFESSIONALS.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. SHORT TITLEThis act may be cited as the
17	"Scope of Practice Act".
18	SECTION 2. PURPOSEThe purpose of the Scope of Practice
19	Act is to provide a procedure for:
20	A. objective review of proposed changes in the
21	scope of practice of health professionals licensed by the state
22	in order to ensure that the changes contribute to the
23	improvement of the overall health of the people of New Mexico;
24	and
25	B. submitting findings, based on an objective
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review, to the governor and the legislature.

SECTION 3. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Scope of Practice Act:

A. "commission" means the New Mexico health policy5 commission;

B. "health profession" means a health-related
activity or occupation licensed pursuant to Chapter 61, Article
2, 3, 4, 5A, 6, 7A, 8, 9, 9A, 10, 10A, 11, 12, 12A, 12B, 12C,
12D, 12E, 14A, 14B, 14C, 14D or 14E NMSA 1978;

10 C. "licensing board" means a licensing board of a 11 specific health profession regulated pursuant to Chapter 61 12 NMSA 1978; and

D. "scope of practice" means those practice activities permitted for a health profession as defined in its licensing act and rules adopted pursuant to that act.

SECTION 4. PROPOSED STATUTORY CHANGE--LICENSING BOARD ANALYSIS.--

A. A member of a licensing board or a licensee of a licensing board or any other person seeking a change in the scope of practice of a health profession shall notify the respective licensing board and request a hearing concerning the proposed change. The licensing board shall notify the commission and shall:

(1) collect data, including information from the applicant and all other appropriate persons, necessary to .183771.2

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1 review the proposal;

2 (2) conduct a technical assessment of the
3 proposal, if necessary with the assistance of a technical
4 advisory group established for that specific purpose, to
5 determine whether the proposal is in the profession's current
6 scope of practice; and

7 (3) provide its analysis, conclusions and any
8 recommendations, together with all materials gathered for the
9 review, to the commission.

B. The person seeking the change in the scope of
practice shall provide the licensing board with all information
requested.

SECTION 5. REVIEW PANELS--APPOINTMENT--DUTIES.--

A. The commission shall, upon notification of a proposed change in a health profession scope of practice, appoint an ad hoc review panel of sufficient numbers and expertise to review and make recommendations on the proposed change. Each panel shall:

(1) include one board member of the licensing board for the health profession from which the proposed change in scope of practice originates;

(2) include the dean of the university of New
Mexico school of medicine; and

Each panel shall be chaired by the director of the commission or the director's designee, who shall be a 3 The panel shall: 4 nonvoting member. familiarize itself with the commission's 5 (1)rules on procedures and criteria for such reviews; 6 7 (2) ensure appropriate public notice of its proceedings; 8 9 (3) invite testimony from persons with special knowledge in the field of the proposed change; 10 assess the proposal using the following (4) 11 12 criteria: whether proposed changes offer (a) 13 potential harm to the health, safety or welfare of consumers; 14 if the proposed changes will benefit (b) 15 the health, safety and welfare of health consumers; 16 (c) what economic impact on overall 17 health care delivery the proposed change is likely to have; 18 (d) whether potential benefits of 19 20 proposed changes outweigh potential harm; and (e) the extent to which the proposed 21 changes will affect the availability, accessibility, delivery 22 and quality of health care in New Mexico; 23 conduct the analysis so as to: (5) 24 (a) consider harm to the public in 25 .183771.2 - 4 -

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1 physical, emotional, economic and social contexts; 2 (b) ensure that consideration of 3 economic and social benefit does not outweigh the potential of significant physical harm to the consumer; and 4 (c) ensure that evidence of potential 5 harm is clearly and directly attributable to the proposal; and 6 7 (6) no later than September 15 of each year, provide to the governor, the New Mexico legislative council, 8 9 the legislative finance committee and the legislative health and human services committee a full report, including 10 legislative recommendations, on each proposed change in scope 11 12 of practice brought before the commission during the previous The director of the commission shall also provide 13 fiscal year. 14 an oral presentation of the report to the legislative finance committee and the legislative health and human services 15 committee. 16 SECTION 6. COMMISSION--SCOPE OF PRACTICE REVIEWS AND 17 18 CRITERIA--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The commission shall: 19 Α. notify annually each licensing board and, 20 whenever possible, each professional association and group of

health professions, of both the licensing board's and the commission's responsibilities to review proposed changes in the scope of practice of health professions;

B. ensure that scope of practice reviews by ad hoc review panels are conducted as public hearings with notice

	3	C. provide staff services to all ad hoc review
	4	panels created pursuant to Section 5 of the Scope of Practice
	5	Act; and
	6	D. provide the legislature with all assistance

	9	SECTION 7. RULESThe commission and each licensing
	10	board shall promulgate such rules as are necessary to carry out
	11	the provisions of the Scope of Practice Act.
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
