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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 10-16D-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010,
19	Chapter 34, Section 1) is amended to read:
20	"10-16D-1. SHORT TITLE[This act] Chapter 10, Article
21	16D NMSA 1978 may be cited as the "Sunshine Portal Transparency
22	Act"."
23	SECTION 2. Section 10-16D-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010,
24	Chapter 34, Section 2) is amended to read:

Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, 13 14 Chapter 34, Section 3) is amended to read: SUNSHINE PORTAL--DEPARTMENT DUTIES.--"10-16D-3. 15 The department, with the department of finance 16 Α. 17 and administration, shall develop, operate and maintain a 18 single internet web site that is free, user-friendly, 19 searchable and accessible to the public, known as the "sunshine 20 portal", to host the state's financial information for the purpose of governmental transparency and accountability to 21 taxpayers. 22

B. No later than October 1, 2010, the department shall create the architecture and the information exchange process for the collection and electronic publication of the .184732.1

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1 state's financial information. 2 C.

No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal 3 shall be available for public access and include updated information as required by Subsection D of this section. 4 The sunshine portal shall provide, at a minimum, D. 5 access to the following information: 6 7 (1)the state's cash balances by account or fund: 8 9 (2) a monthly summary of the state's investment accounts [under the control of the state investment 10 council; 11 12 (3) annual operating budgets for each state agency with monthly expenditures by category; 13 14 (4) contracts that a state agency enters into for the lease, sale or development of state land [or if they 15 have a total value] and state contracts that have a total 16 contract price of more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), 17 naming [both] the recipient [and] of the contract, the purpose 18 of the contract and the amounts expended; 19 (5) 20 the revenue that the state received in the preceding month by source, such as type of tax, fee, fine, 21 administrative fee or other collection category; 22 special appropriations received outside (6) 23 the general appropriation act by each state agency and the 24 purpose of those appropriations; 25 .184732.1

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1 approved budget adjustment requests by (7) 2 state agency and affected budget category; (8) quarterly consensus revenue estimates; 3 [(8)] (9) reversions and cash balances by 4 5 state agency and fund; [(9)] (10) appropriations for capital 6 7 projects, identified by project location, type of project and funding source; 8 9 [(10)] (11) a directory of all employee positions, other than exempt employee positions, identified 10 only by state agency, position title and salary; 11 12 [(11)] (12) a directory of all exempt employee positions, identified by state agency, position title, salary 13 and the name of the individual that holds the position; 14 (13) information relating to local education 15 providers compiled and published by the public education 16 department pursuant to Section 10-16D-6 NMSA 1978; 17 [(12)] (14) a link to an open meeting tracker 18 19 web site upon which each state agency shall post open meetings 20 scheduled for the current month and the next month, including the time and place of the meeting, the subject of the meeting 21 and an agenda; 22 (15) a link to the list of individuals who are 23 delinquent in child support payments, as published by the human 24 services department pursuant to Section 40-4A-17 NMSA 1978; 25 .184732.1

3	accessing information relating to occupational licenses;
4	(17) a link to the state auditor's web site
5	for the purpose of accessing financial audits;

7	[(14)] <u>(19)</u> a link to the New Mexico
8	Administrative Code;
9	[(15)] <u>(20)</u> a link to the secretary of state's
10	web sites for lobbyist regulation;
11	[(16)] <u>(21)</u> an annual summary within three
12	months after the end of the fiscal year, or as soon thereafter
13	as the information becomes available, of the state's fiscal

21	E. State agencies shall provide updated financial
22	information as frequently as possible but at least monthly.
23	F. The department shall update the web site as new
24	information is received but at least monthly, include
25	information from the previous month or year, where relevant,
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1	for comparison purposes and maintain the web site as the
2	primary source of public information about the activity of the
3	state government."
4	SECTION 4. A new section of the Sunshine Portal
5	Transparency Act, Section 10-16D-6 NMSA 1978, is enacted to
6	read:
7	"10-16D-6. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] LOCAL EDUCATION PROVIDERS
8	REQUIRED INFORMATIONPUBLICATION BY PUBLIC EDUCATION
9	DEPARTMENT ON THE SUNSHINE PORTAL
10	A. Commencing no later than July 1, 2012, and on a
11	continuing basis thereafter, each local education provider
12	shall provide the following information to the public education
13	department for online publication on the sunshine portal, in a
14	downloadable format, for free public access:
15	(1) the annual operating budget, commencing
16	with the budget for fiscal year 2012;
17	(2) salary schedules and policies;
18	(3) a directory of the local education
19	provider's employee positions by school name, title and salary;
20	(4) monthly expenditures by category;
21	(5) monthly revenue by source; and
22	(6) an inventory of all real property owned by
23	the local education provider, including the location of the
24	property, the size of the property, a description of the
25	improvements on the property and a description of the use of
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1 the property.

2 Β. As soon as practicable after July 1, 2011, the 3 public education department shall begin working with the department of information technology to create a monthly data 4 extract from applicable computer database systems. 5 As information is received pursuant to Subsection A of this 6 7 section, the public education department, working with the 8 department of information technology, shall publish the 9 information on the sunshine portal. The public education department and each local 10 C. education provider that maintains a web site shall have a link 11 12 to the sunshine portal on its web site." SECTION 5. TEMPORARY PROVISION--IMPLEMENTATION.--13 14 Α. The information required by Paragraph (13) of

Subsection D of Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 shall be available on the sunshine portal as soon as possible, but no later than October 1, 2012.

B. The information required by Paragraphs (15), (16) and (17) of Subsection D of Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 shall be available on the sunshine portal as soon as possible, but no later than January 1, 2012.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2011.

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
