### AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE; ENACTING THE KATIE FAITH MARTINEZ PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS ACT; ESTABLISHING A LIST OF THE RIGHTS GUARANTEED TO ALL HEALTH CARE PATIENTS IN NEW MEXICO; PROVIDING PROCEDURES FOR PATIENTS WHOSE RIGHTS HAVE BEEN VIOLATED TO FILE COMPLAINTS WITH THE NEW MEXICO MEDICAL BOARD; REQUIRING HEALTH CARE FACILITIES TO PROVIDE ALL PATIENTS WITH A WRITTEN COPY OF THEIR RIGHTS UNDER THIS ACT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

- SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.--This act may be cited as the "Katie Faith Martinez Patients' Bill of Rights Act".
- SECTION 2. PURPOSES OF ACT.--The purposes of the Katie Faith Martinez Patients' Bill of Rights Act are to:
- create a uniform bill of rights guaranteed to all patients receiving professional health care in New Mexico; .184137.1

5	SECTION 3. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Katie Faith				
6	Martinez Patients' Bill of Rights Act:				
7	A. "emergency" means a situation in which there is				
8	an imminent threat of a disaster causing immediate peril to				
9	life that timely action can avert or minimize;				
10	B. "health care" means any care, treatment, servic				
11	or procedure to maintain, diagnose or otherwise affect an				
12	individual's physical or mental condition;				
13	C. "health care facility" means a facility,				
14	institution or agency at which health care is provided in the				
15	ordinary course of business;				
16	D. "locum tenens" means an individual that				
17	substitutes for another member of the individual's profession;

19	E. "patient" means an individual seeking or				
20	receiving health care.				
21	SECTION 4. PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTSA patient has a				
22	right to:				
23	A. receive considerate and respectful care at all				
24	times and under all circumstances, with recognition of the				
25	patient's personal dignity;				

- B. know by name the attending physician primarily responsible for the patient's care and any person responsible for undertaking any medical procedure or providing any medical treatment for the patient;
- C. obtain complete and current information concerning diagnosis, treatment and any known prognosis in terms that the patient can reasonably be expected to understand:
- D. receive, except in emergency situations, from the patient's physician information necessary to give informed consent prior to the start of any medical procedure or treatment;
- E. refuse treatment to the extent permitted by law and to be informed of the medical consequences of any exercise of that right;
- F. receive every consideration of privacy concerning the patient's own medical care and treatment;
- G. expect that all communications and records pertaining to the patient's care will be treated as confidential;
- H. know the identity and professional status of individuals providing health care to the patient, including the professional title and role of each health care provider and whether that individual is providing health care as a locum tenens or on a temporary basis through a staffing agency;

- I. receive a reasonable continuity of care and to be informed by the attending physician of any continuing health care requirements following discharge;
- J. receive an itemized, detailed and understandable explanation of health care charges regardless of the source of payment; and
- K. have an interpreter if the patient does not speak the predominant languages of the community or is deaf or hearing impaired and has a right to understand the health care and treatment being provided to the patient regardless of any communication barrier.

SECTION 5. BILL OF PATIENTS' RIGHTS NON-EXHAUSTIVE.--The Katie Faith Martinez Patients' Bill of Rights Act is not intended to be all-inclusive and shall not be interpreted to modify, abrogate or infringe upon any right or privilege that is not expressly included in that act.

SECTION 6. FAILURE TO COMPLY--DISCIPLINARY ACTION.--A health care provider's failure to comply with a provision of the Katie Faith Martinez Patients' Bill of Rights Act may constitute a basis for disciplinary action pursuant to the Medical Practice Act. A patient may file a complaint based on any failure to comply with the New Mexico medical board.

SECTION 7. REQUIRED PUBLICATION OF PATIENTS' BILL OF RIGHTS.--Except in emergency situations, a health care facility shall distribute a summary of the obligations set forth in the .184137.1

Katie Faith Martinez Patients' Bill of Right Act to all patients who seek medical treatment at the facility; the summary shall be written in clear language and in easily readable print. The summary must indicate that the patient has the right to directly contact the New Mexico medical board to make a complaint about a health care provider's failure to comply with the patient's rights and shall include the address and telephone number of the New Mexico medical board.

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
