16	SECTION 1. A new section of the Motor Vehicle Code is
17	enacted to read:

19	A. It is unlawful for a person to:
20	(1) knowingly fail to install an airbag in a
21	motor vehicle after representing to another person that the
22	person will install an airbag;
23	(2) knowingly install a counterfeit airbag in

- represent to another that a counterfeit airbag is not counterfeit;
- intentionally alter an airbag that is not (5) counterfeit in a manner that causes the airbag to not meet all applicable federal safety regulations for an airbag designed to be installed in a motor vehicle of a particular make, model and year; or
- (6) assist another in violating the provisions of this subsection.
- A first conviction pursuant to this section is a misdemeanor and the offender shall be sentenced pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-18-15 NMSA 1978.
- Upon a second or subsequent conviction pursuant to this section, an offender is guilty of a third degree felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-18-5 NMSA 1978.
- D. A person that causes great bodily harm to a human being as a result of a violation of the provisions of this section is guilty of a second degree felony and shall be sentenced pursuant to the provisions of Section 31-18-5 NMSA 1978.

## Ε. As used in this section:

"counterfeit airbag" means an airbag that (1) does not meet all applicable federal safety regulations for an .184637.1
