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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. A new section of the Food Service Sanitation
16	Act is enacted to read:
17	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] PET DOGS IN OUTDOOR DINING AREAS
18	REQUIREMENTS
19	A. A food service establishment may allow pet dogs
20	in designated outdoor dining areas of the establishment if the
21	following requirements are met:
22	(1) no pet dog shall be allowed in any area
23	where food is prepared;
24	(2) patrons shall keep their pet dogs on a
25	leash at all times and keep their pet dogs under reasonable
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1 control; 2 (3) employees shall wash their hands 3 immediately after touching, petting or otherwise handling pet 4 dogs; (4) pet dogs shall not be allowed on chairs, 5 tables or other furnishings; 6 7 (5) accidents involving pet waste shall be cleaned immediately and the area sanitized; and 8 9 (6) a sign or signs shall be posted to place the public on notice that the designated outdoor dining area is 10 available for the use of patrons with pet dogs. 11 12 Β. A food service establishment may in its discretion prohibit pet dogs in outdoor dining areas. If a 13 14 food service establishment allows pet dogs in a designated outdoor dining area, the food service establishment shall have 15 the right to refuse to serve the owner of a pet dog if the 16 owner fails to exercise reasonable control over the pet dog or 17 the pet dog is otherwise behaving in a manner that compromises 18 or threatens to compromise the health or safety of any person 19 20 present in the restaurant." SECTION 2. Section 25-1-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1977, 21 Chapter 309, Section 4) is amended to read: 22 "25-1-4. BOARD--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The board shall 23 promulgate procedural and substantive regulations consistent 24 with the provisions of Section [12-12-13 NMSA 1953] 74-1-9 NMSA 25

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2	A. requiring food service establishments to prepare
3	and serve food in a manner safe for human consumption, free
4	from adulteration, spoilage, contamination and unwholesomeness,
5	and, to accomplish this standard, the following areas of food
6	service establishment operations shall be covered by the
7	regulations:
8	(1) disease control;
9	(2) employee hygiene and sanitation;
10	(3) food service establishment premises
11	sanitation;
12	(4) all aspects of food service establishment
13	construction relating to food service sanitation, including
14	requirements for food service establishment construction plans
15	and specifications review and approval by the [agency]
16	division;
17	(5) control of pests and infestation by pests;
18	(6) lavatory and toilet facility placement and
19	sanitation;
20	(7) lavatory hygiene;
21	(8) food equipment and utensil design and
22	construction;
23	(9) food equipment and utensil storage and
24	handling;
25	(10) liquid and solid waste disposal;
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1 (11) food and drink preparation, handling, 2 display and storage; food service establishment ventilation; 3 (12)4 (13) water supply; itinerant food service establishment 5 (14)construction and operation; and 6 7 (15)any other facet of food service operations that reasonably may be considered to pose an 8 9 existing or potential hazard to the health of the consuming public; provided that no regulation shall prohibit food service 10 establishments from allowing pet dogs in designated outdoor 11 12 dining areas; 13

B. the issuance, suspension and revocation of permits required under the Food Service Sanitation Act, which regulations shall provide for prior notice to and a hearing for any applicant for or holder of a permit when the [agencyproposed] division-proposed action is to deny an application for or suspend or revoke a permit, except in those specified instances under the provisions of the Food Service Sanitation Act when the [agency] division is authorized to take any of the foregoing actions without prior notice and hearing; and

C. establishing requirements for inspections of food service establishments, which shall include provisions for inspections at a frequency of at least once every twelve months."
