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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 29-19-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003,
18	Chapter 255, Section 6, as amended) is amended to read:
19	"29-19-6. [APPEAL] <u>LICENSE ISSUANCE</u> LICENSE RENEWAL
20	[REFRESHER FIREARMS TRAINING COURSE] LOST OR STOLEN LICENSE
21	SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF LICENSE
22	A. Pursuant to rules adopted by the department, the
23	department, within thirty days after receiving a completed
24	application for a concealed handgun license and the results of
25	a national criminal background check on the applicant, shall:
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1 issue a concealed handgun license to an (1) 2 applicant; or deny the application on the grounds that 3 (2) the applicant failed to qualify for a concealed handgun license 4 pursuant to the provisions of the Concealed Handgun Carry Act. 5 Β. Information relating to an applicant or to a 6 7 licensee received by the department or any other law enforcement agency is confidential and exempt from public 8 disclosure unless an order to disclose information is issued by 9 a court of competent jurisdiction. The information shall be 10 made available by the department to a state or local law 11 12 enforcement agency upon request by the agency. C. A concealed handgun license issued by the 13 14 department shall include: a color photograph of the licensee; (1) 15 the licensee's name, address and date (2) 16 of birth; 17 the expiration date of the concealed (3) 18 19 handgun license; and 20 (4) the category and the largest caliber of handgun that the licensee is licensed to carry, with a 21 statement that the licensee is licensed to carry smaller 22 caliber handguns but shall carry only one concealed handgun at 23 any given time. 24 D. A licensee shall notify the department within 25 .182837.2 - 2 -

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thirty days regarding a change of the licensee's name or permanent address. A licensee shall notify the department within ten days if the licensee's concealed handgun license is lost, stolen or destroyed.

E. If a concealed handgun license is lost, stolen or destroyed, the license is invalid and the licensee may obtain a duplicate license by furnishing the department a notarized statement that the original license was lost, stolen or destroyed and paying a reasonable fee. If the license is lost or stolen, the licensee shall file a police report with a local law enforcement agency and include the police case number in the notarized statement.

F. A licensee may renew a concealed handgun license by submitting to the department <u>up to ninety days prior to the</u> <u>expiration of the license</u>:

(1) a completed renewal form, under penalty of perjury, designed and provided by the department;

(2) a payment of a seventy-five-dollar(\$75.00) renewal fee; and

(3) a certificate of completion of a four-hour refresher firearms training course approved by the department.

G. The department shall [conduct a national] update the criminal records check of a licensee seeking to renew a license without requiring additional fingerprints. A concealed handgun license shall not be renewed more than [sixty] <u>ninety</u> .182837.2

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1 days after it has expired. A licensee who fails to renew a 2 concealed handgun license within [sixty] ninety days after it 3 has expired may apply for a new concealed handgun license pursuant to the provisions of the Concealed Handgun Carry Act. 4 [H. A licensee shall complete a two-hour refresher 5 firearms training course two years after the issuance of an 6 7 original or renewed license. The refresher course shall be approved by the department and shall be taken twenty-two to 8 9 twenty-six months after the issuance of an original or renewed license. A certificate of completion shall be submitted to the 10 department no later than thirty days after completion of the 11 12 course. I. The department shall suspend or revoke a 13 concealed handgun license if: 14 the licensee provided the department with 15 (1)false information on the application form or renewal form for a 16 bracketed material] = delete concealed handgun license; 17 the licensee did not satisfy the criteria (2) 18 19 for issuance of a concealed handgun license at the time the 20 license was issued; or subsequent to receiving a concealed (3) 21 handgun license, the licensee violated a provision of the 22 Concealed Handgun Carry Act." 23 SECTION 2.
