19	CHAPTERSThe state recognizes a local county government as
20	having the capability and capacity to act as a fiscal agent for
21	chapters of the Navajo Nation that have been certified pursuant
22	to the Navajo Nation Local Government Act codified under Title
23	26 of the Navajo Nation Code and located within the exterior
24	boundaries of the county. A local county government may enter
25	into a memorandum of understanding with a certified chapter of

1	the Navajo Nation to act as a fiscal agent for capital outlay
2	projects to plan, design and construct improvements,
3	infrastructure or purchase tangible property with a value of
4	five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) or less. Unless
5	otherwise negotiated, an administrative fee of no more than
6	five percent of a project's cost may be charged by the local
7	county government to serve as fiscal agent."
8	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
9	provisions of this act is July 1, 2011.
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
