11 RELATING TO INSURANCE; AMENDING A SECTION OF THE WORKERS'
12 COMPENSATION ACT TO PROVIDE FOR RECOVERY OF ENFORCEMENT COSTS
13 FROM EMPLOYERS.

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15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

16 SECTION 1. Section 52-1-62 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1937,
17 Chapter 92, Section 18, as amended) is amended to read:

18 "52-1-62. DIRECTOR TO ENFORCE WORKERS' COMPENSATION
19 ACT.--For the purpose of enforcing the Workers' Compensation
20 Act, [~~there are hereby conferred upon~~] the director has the
21 following powers and duties:

22 A. when any employer subject to the provisions of
23 the Workers' Compensation Act fails to comply with Section
24 52-1-4 NMSA 1978 relating to the filing of an undertaking in
25 the nature of insurance or security for the payment of benefits

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1 under the Workers' Compensation Act, the director is empowered
2 to institute in [~~his~~] the director's own name an action in the
3 district court of Santa Fe county or the county where the
4 employer resides or has [~~his~~] a principal office or place of
5 business to enjoin the employer from continuing [~~his~~] business
6 operations until [~~he~~] the employer has complied with the
7 provisions of Section 52-1-4 NMSA 1978, and upon a showing of
8 the facts above recited, the court shall grant such injunction.
9 In any such action, the attorney general or district attorney
10 for the judicial district where the action is brought shall
11 represent the director. The director is empowered to seek
12 reimbursement from the employer of all costs associated with
13 the enforcement of Section 52-1-4 NMSA 1978, including but not
14 limited to the costs of service of process, recording fees and
15 locksmith expenses. Any reimbursement shall be deposited in
16 the workers' compensation administration fund; and

17 B. for the purpose of ascertaining the correctness
18 of any reported wage expenditure, the number of [~~men~~] persons
19 employed and other information necessary in the administration
20 of the Workers' Compensation Act, the director may, upon [~~his~~]
21 the director's own initiative or upon request of any interested
22 party, hold hearings and subpoena all books, records and
23 payrolls of any employer subject to the provisions of the
24 Workers' Compensation Act [~~which~~] that show or reflect in any
25 way upon the amount of wage expenditures of such employer or
