"commercial contract services" means (1)8 health care services performed by a health care practitioner pursuant to a contract with a managed health care provider or health care insurer other than those health care services provided for medicare patients pursuant to Title 18 of the federal Social Security Act or for medicaid patients pursuant to Title 19 or Title 21 of the federal Social Security Act;

"health care insurer" means a person that: (2) (a) has a valid certificate of authority in good standing pursuant to the New Mexico Insurance Code to act as an insurer, health maintenance organization or nonprofit

(b) contracts to reimburse licensed health care practitioners for providing basic health services to enrollees at negotiated fee rates;

health care plan or prepaid dental plan; and

(a) a chiropractic physician licensed pursuant to the provisions of the Chiropractic Physician Practice Act;

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"health care practitioner" means:
