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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 24-14-27 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1961,
17	Chapter 44, Section 25, as amended) is amended to read:
18	"24-14-27. DISCLOSURE OF RECORDS
19	A. It is unlawful for any person to permit
20	inspection of or to disclose information contained in vital
21	records or to copy or issue a copy of all or part of any record
22	except as authorized by law.
23	B. The department shall provide access to record
24	level data required by the New Mexico health policy commission
25	and the health information system created in the Health
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Information System Act. The New Mexico health policy commission and the health information system may only release record level data obtained from vital records in the aggregate. For the purposes of this subsection, "record level data" means one or more unique and non-aggregated data elements relating to a single identifiable individual. The department may authorize the disclosure of data contained in vital records for other research purposes.

9 C. When one hundred years have elapsed after the date of birth or fifty years have elapsed after the date of 10 death, the vital records of these events in the custody of the 11 12 state registrar shall become open public records, and information shall be made available in accordance with 13 14 regulations that provide for the continued safekeeping of the records; provided that vital records of birth shall not become 15 open public records prior to the individual's death. 16

D. In addition to the death certificate containing detailed medical and demographic information protected pursuant to Subsection A of this section, the department shall create and make available a public death certificate that may be disclosed, inspected and copied and that shall provide nonconfidential information, including: (1) the decedent's legal name;

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(2) the decedent's date of death;

(3) the county in which the decedent died;

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1	(4) the decedent's year of birth;
2	(5) the last four digits of the decedent's
3	social security number;
4	(6) the decedent's gender;
5	(7) the decedent's marital status and, if
6	applicable, the surviving spouse's name;
7	(8) the decedent's maiden name, if any; and
8	(9) the death certificate state file number."
9	SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATEThe effective date of the
10	provisions of this act is July 1, 2011.
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
