16	SECTION 1. A new section of the New Mexico Works Act is
17	enacted to read:
18	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] FAMILY FORMATION AND RESPONSIBLE
19	FATHERHOOD PROGRAMS
20	A. In fiscal year 2012 and each subsequent fiscal
21	year, at least one percent of the federal block grant for the
22	state's temporary assistance for needy families programs, which
23	provides for a portion of the grant to be spent on programs and
24	services that encourage family formation, marriage and
25	responsible fatherhood, shall be spent on programs to enhance
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1 family formation and responsible fatherhood. 2 Β. Family formation programs include: 3 educational programs in high schools on (1) the value of marriage, relationship skills and budgeting; 4 (2) marriage education, marriage skills and 5 relationship skills programs that may include parenting skills, 6 7 financial management, conflict resolution and job and career 8 advancement for non-married pregnant women and non-married 9 expectant fathers; premarital education, marriage skills 10 (3) training and relationship skills programs for engaged couples 11 12 and couples or individuals interested in marriage; (4) marriage enhancement and marriage skills 13 14 training programs for married couples; divorce reduction programs that teach 15 (5) relationship skills; and 16 marriage mentoring programs that use 17 (6) married couples as role models and mentors in at-risk 18 19 communities. 20 C. Responsible fatherhood programs include programs that: 21 promote or sustain marriage, by providing: (1) 22 (a) information about the benefits of 23 marriage and two-parent involvement for children; 24 information about enhancing 25 (b) .183418.2 - 2 -

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1 relationship skills; 2 (c) education regarding how to control 3 aggressive behavior; (d) information on domestic violence and 4 child abuse; 5 marriage preparation programs; 6 (e) 7 (f) premarital counseling; skills-based marriage education; and 8 (g) 9 (h) family financial planning seminars; promote responsible parenting by providing 10 (2) training such as skills-based parenting education; and 11 12 (3) foster economic stability by helping fathers improve their economic status through work first 13 services, job search, job training, subsidized employment, job 14 retention and job enhancement. 15 The federal funds for family formation and D. 16 responsible fatherhood programs shall be administered under 17 contract with a state public post-secondary educational 18 institution that has demonstrated success in administering 19 20 temporary assistance for needy families programs, such as work force development programs, in both the north and south of the 21 state. 22 Ε. Family formation and responsible fatherhood 23 programs shall offer at least eight hours of education or 24 training to individuals or couples, using evidence-based 25

	3	F. The secretary may promulgate rules for family
	4	formation and responsible fatherhood programs.
	5	G. The secretary shall report annually through 2014
