19	"29-2-6. QUALIFICATIONS OF MEMBERS
20	A. Members of the New Mexico state police, except
21	the chief, shall:
22	(1) at the time of their appointment, be
23	citizens of the United States;
24	(2) at the time of their appointment, have
25	reached twenty-one years of age;
