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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of the Criminal Code is enacted
18	to read:
19	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] GANG RECRUITMENT
20	A. Gang recruitment consists of the solicitation or
21	recruitment of another with the intent that the person
22	solicited or recruited:
23	(1) knowingly participate in a pattern of
24	criminal street gang activity; or
25	(2) promote, further or assist in felonious

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1 conduct by members of a criminal street gang.

B. Whoever commits gang recruitment is guilty of a
misdemeanor. Whoever commits gang recruitment of a minor is
guilty of a fourth degree felony.

5 C. Gang recruitment by threat or violence consists
6 of threatening another with physical violence on two or more
7 separate occasions within a thirty-day period, or using
8 physical violence, with the intent to coerce, induce or solicit
9 another to:

10 (1) knowingly participate in a pattern of 11 criminal street gang activity; or

(2) promote, further or assist in felonious conduct by members of a criminal street gang.

D. Whoever commits gang recruitment by threat or violence is guilty of a fourth degree felony. Whoever commits gang recruitment of a minor by threat or violence is guilty of a third degree felony.

E. As used in this section:

(1) "criminal street gang" means an ongoing organization, association or group of three or more persons, whether formal or informal, who associate under a common name or have an identifying sign or symbol, whose members individually or collectively engage in or have engaged in a pattern of criminal street gang activity and having as one of its primary activities the commission of one or more of the .185250.1
