A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES DEPARTMENTS OF DEFENSE AND ENERGY
TO DISMANTLE NUCLEAR WEAPONS AT KIRTLAND AIR FORCE BASE.

WHEREAS, major events such as the shuttle Columbia disaster on February 1, 2003 and the terrorist attacks of September 11, 2001 have taken place and, after investigation, have revealed great lapses in safety and precautionary measures; and

WHEREAS, Albuquerque is reported in professional publications and local newspapers to be the home of the largest concentration of nuclear munitions anywhere in the world; and

WHEREAS, newspapers have reported special tests and training exercises conducted at Kirtland air force base that simulate accidents in which nuclear materials have been dispersed in a subcritical nature; and

WHEREAS, the damage to Albuquerque's local economy and civic life will be extensive if there is an accident involving the nuclear munitions stored at Kirtland air force base;
