CONTRIBUTION LIMITATIONS--CANDIDATES--18 19 POLITICAL COMMITTEES. --20 The following contributions by the following persons are prohibited: 21 (1) from a person, not including a political 22 committee, to a: 23 (a) candidate for nonstatewide office, 24 including the candidate's campaign committee, in an amount that 25

will cause that person's total contributions to the candidate to exceed two thousand three hundred dollars (\$2,300) [during the primary election or two thousand three hundred dollars (\$2,300) during the general election] in a calendar year;

(b) candidate for statewide office, including the candidate's campaign committee, in an amount that will cause that person's total contributions to the candidate to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) [during the primary election or five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during the general election] in a calendar year; or

(c) political committee in an amount that will cause that person's total contributions to the political committee to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) [during a primary election or five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during a general election] in a calendar year; and

- 2) from a political committee to:
- (a) a candidate for office, including the candidate's campaign committee, in an amount that will cause the political committee's total contributions to the candidate to exceed five thousand dollars (\$5,000) [during the primary election or five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during the general election] in a calendar year; or
- (b) another political committee in an amount that will cause that political committee's total contributions to the political committee to exceed five .188957.1

thousand dollars (\$5,000) [during a primary election or five thousand dollars (\$5,000) during a general election] in a calendar year.

- B. All contributions made by a person to a candidate, either directly or indirectly, including contributions that are in any way earmarked or otherwise directed through another person to a candidate, shall be treated as contributions from the person to that candidate.
- C. A person, including a political committee, shall not knowingly accept or solicit a contribution, directly or indirectly, including a contribution earmarked or otherwise directed or coordinated through another person, including a political committee, that violates the contribution limits provided for in this section.
- D. On the day after each general election, the contribution amounts provided in Subsection A of this section shall be increased by the percentage of the preceding two calendar years' increase of the consumer price index for all urban consumers, United States city average for all items, published by the United States department of labor. The amount of the increase shall be rounded to the nearest multiple of one hundred dollars (\$100). The secretary of state shall publish by October 1 before each general election the adjusted contribution limits that shall take effect the day after the following general election.

F. The limitation on contributions to a candidate provided for in Subsection A of this section shall not apply to a candidate's own contribution from the candidate's personal funds to the candidate's own campaign.

[G. For the purposes of this section:

(1) "primary election" means the period
beginning on the day after the general election for the
applicable office and ending on the day of the primary for that
office; and

(2) "general election" means the period
beginning on the day after the primary for the applicable
office and ending on the day of the general election for that
office.]"

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is January 1, 2013.
