### A RESOLUTION

AMENDING THE HOUSE RULES TO PROVIDE THAT APPOINTMENTS TO STANDING COMMITTEES BE MADE BY THE RESPECTIVE CAUCUSES.

WHEREAS, House Rule 24-1 provides that the rules of the house may be amended by a two-thirds' vote of the members of the house or by a majority vote of the members of the house upon the recommendation of the rules and order of business committee;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO that House Rule 9-1 be amended to read:

"9-1 [The speaker shall appoint] All appointments to committees created by the house, except those committees where the members are designated in the motion creating them, [and all appointments] shall

be <u>made</u> by the <u>respective caucuses</u>, announced in open session and made a matter of record in the journal, <u>subject</u> to the following:

- (a) the caucuses shall make their
  appointments in the order of their membership of the
  house, with the caucus that has the most members of
  the house making its appointments first; provided
  that the order of making appointments for any
  caucuses that have equal members shall be determined
  by lot;
- (b) each caucus other than the caucus making the initial appointments shall appoint members to committees in the number that reflects its proportion of the membership of the house; provided that each caucus shall be entitled to appoint at least one member to each committee;
- (c) a member who is not affiliated with a caucus may appoint himself or herself to no more than two substantive committees;
- (d) each caucus shall make its

  appointments in such a manner as to minimize

  scheduling conflicts for members; and
- (e) except as provided for in this rule,
  all appointments shall comply with the restrictions
  in House Rule 9-3.".
