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18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:							
19	SECTION 1. A new section of the Optometry Act is enacted							
20	to read:							
21	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew a							
22	license to practice optometry unless the applicant attests to							
23	knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal							
24	centers for disease control and prevention regarding the							
25	prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe

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and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 2. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew a license to practice nursing unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

10 SECTION 3. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is 11 enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not certify, or renew the certification of, a hemodialysis technician unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 4. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not certify, or renew the certification of, a medication aide unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through .190690.1

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safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 5. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a certified nurse practitioner unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

10 SECTION 6. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is 11 enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a certified registered nurse anesthetist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 7. A new section of the Nursing Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a clinical nurse specialist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through .190690.1

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safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 8. A new section of the Dental Health Care Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a dentist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices. In addition, the dentist applicant shall attest that any unlicensed person who is under the dentist's control and supervision, and whose duties involve injection practices, has knowledge of and is in compliance with the guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 9. A new section of the Dental Health Care Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a dental hygienist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 10. A new section of the Dental Health Care Act .190690.1

is enacted to read:

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2	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not certify, or renew							
3	certification of, a dental assistant, an expanded-function							
4	dental auxiliary, a community dental health coordinator or a							
5	dental assistant certified in expanded functions unless the

11 SECTION 11. A new section of the Medical Practice Act is 12 enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a physician unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices. In addition, the physician applicant shall attest that any unlicensed person who is under the physician's control and supervision, and whose duties involve injection practices, has knowledge of and is in compliance with the guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

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SECTION 12. A new section of the Physician Assistant Act
 is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a physician assistant unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

9 SECTION 13. A new section of the Anesthesiologist
10 Assistants Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] The board shall not grant or renew the license of an anesthesiologist assistant unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 14. A new section of the Podiatry Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew a license to practice podiatry unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 15. Section 61-10-15 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1933, .190690.1

"61-10	-15. IS	SUANCE	-RENEWAL	REFUSAL	AND	REVOCATION	OF

A. The board of osteopathic medical examiners shall not issue or renew an osteopathic license unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices. In addition, the osteopathic physician applicant shall attest that any unlicensed person who is under the physician's control and supervision, and whose duties involve injection practices, has knowledge of and is in compliance with the guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices.

<u>B.</u> The board of osteopathic medical examiners may either refuse to issue or may suspend or revoke any license for any one or any combination of the following causes:

[A.] (1) conviction of a felony, as shown by a certified copy of the record of the court of conviction;

 $[B_{\cdot}]$ (2) the obtaining of or an attempt to obtain a license or <u>the</u> practice in the profession for money or any other thing of value by fraudulent misrepresentation;

[C.] (3) gross malpractice;

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LICENSE.--

1 [D.] (4) advertising, practicing or attempting 2 to practice under a name other than one's own; [E.] (5) advertising by means of knowingly 3 false or deceptive statements; 4 $[F_{\cdot}]$ (6) habitual drunkenness or habitual 5 addiction to the use of morphine, cocaine or other habit-6 7 forming drugs; or 8 [G.] (7) immoral, dishonorable or 9 unprofessional conduct. C. The board [may neither] of osteopathic medical 10 examiners shall not refuse to issue, [nor to] renew, [nor] 11 12 suspend [nor] or revoke any license, however, for any of [these] the causes pursuant to Subsection B of this section 13 unless the person accused has been given at least twenty days' 14 notice in writing of the charge against [him] the person and a 15 public hearing by the board of osteopathic medical examiners 16 with right of review of the board's decision by the district 17 court of the first judicial district by certiorari on petition 18 19 of the party against whom the board's decision is rendered. 20 D. SECTION 16. A new section of the Osteopathic Physicians' Assistants Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] The board shall not grant or renew the license of an osteopathic physician assistant unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 17. A new section of the Pharmacy Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a pharmacist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices. In addition, the pharmacist applicant shall attest that any unlicensed person who is under the pharmacist's control and supervision, and whose duties involve injection practices, has knowledge of and is in compliance with the guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

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SECTION 18. A new section of the Pharmacy Act is enacted to read:

"[NEW MATERIAL] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a pharmacy unless the applicant attests that its employees, independent contractors or agents who are authorized by the pharmacy to administer, and whose duties include the administration of, drugs by injection have knowledge of and comply with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 19. A new section of the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not grant or renew the license of a doctor of oriental medicine unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 20. A new section of the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not certify, or renew the certification of, an auricular detoxification specialist unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and .190690.1

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prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection practices."

SECTION 21. A new section of the Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine Practice Act is enacted to read:

"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] The board shall not certify, or renew the 7 certification of, a doctor of oriental medicine in the four 8 expanded practices of basic injection therapy, injection 9 therapy, intravenous therapy and bioidentical hormone therapy unless the applicant attests to knowledge of and compliance 10 with guidelines of the federal centers for disease control and 11 12 prevention regarding the prevention of transmission of infectious agents through safe and appropriate injection 13 practices."
