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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
16	SECTION 1. Section 10-16D-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010,
17	Chapter 34, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

20	A. "contract" means an agreement with a state

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1 SECTION 2. Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read: 2 3 "10-16D-3. SUNSHINE PORTAL--DEPARTMENT DUTIES.--4 Α. The department, with the department of finance 5 and administration, shall develop, operate and maintain a single internet web site that is free, user-friendly, 6 7 searchable and accessible to the public, known as the "sunshine 8 portal", to host the state's financial information for the 9 purpose of governmental transparency and accountability to 10 taxpayers. No later than October 1, 2010, the department 11 Β. 12 shall create the architecture and the information exchange process for the collection and electronic publication of the 13 14 state's financial information. No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal 15 С. shall be available for public access and include updated 16 17 information as required by Subsection D of this section. 18 The sunshine portal shall provide, at a minimum, D. 19 access to the following information: 20 (1)the state's cash balances by account or fund; 21 a monthly summary of the state's (2) 22 investment accounts; 23 (3) annual operating budgets for each state 24 agency with monthly expenditures by category; 25 .191124.1 - 4 -

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1 contracts that a state agency enters into (4) 2 for the lease, sale or development of state land and state contracts that have a total contract price of more than twenty 3 thousand dollars (\$20,000), naming the recipient of the 4 contract, the purpose of the contract and the amounts expended; 5 (5) the revenue that the state received in the 6 7 preceding month by source, such as type of tax, fee, fine, administrative fee or other collection category; 8 9 (6) special appropriations received outside the general appropriation act by each state agency and the 10 purpose of those appropriations; 11 12 (7) approved budget adjustment requests by state agency and affected budget category; 13 14 quarterly consensus revenue estimates; (8) reversions and cash balances by state (9) 15 agency and fund; 16 (10) appropriations for capital projects, 17 identified by project location, type of project and funding 18 19 source; a directory of all employee positions, 20 (11)other than exempt employee positions, identified only by state 21 agency, position title and salary; 22 (12) a directory of all exempt employee 23 positions, identified by state agency, position title, salary 24 and the name of the individual that holds the position; 25 .191124.1 - 5 -

SECTION 3. A new section of the Sunshine Portal 15 Transparency Act is enacted to read: 16 "[NEW MATERIAL] MIDDLE RIO GRANDE CONSERVANCY 17 18 DISTRICT--REQUIRED INFORMATION--PUBLICATION ON THE SUNSHINE 19 PORTAL . - -20 Α. Commencing no later than January 1, 2014, and on a continuing basis thereafter, the middle Rio Grande 21 conservancy district shall cause the following information to 22 be published on the sunshine portal, in a downloadable format, 23 for free public access: 24 the annual operating budget, commencing 25 (1) .191124.1

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1 with the budget for fiscal year 2014; 2 (2)salary schedules and policies; 3 (3) a directory of the district employees by name, title and salary; 4 monthly expenditures by category; 5 (4) monthly revenue by source; 6 (5) 7 (6) a list of all outstanding contracts with a total maximum expenditure of more than twenty thousand dollars 8 9 (\$20,000), showing the date of the contract, the purpose of the contract, the name and address of the contractor and the 10 expenditures to date; and 11 12 (7) an inventory of all real property owned by the district, including the location of the property, the size 13 14 of the property, a description of the improvements on the property and a description of the use of the property. 15 Β. As soon as practicable after July 1, 2013, the 16 middle Rio Grande conservancy district shall begin working with 17 the department to create a monthly data extract from applicable 18 19 computer database systems. As information is received pursuant 20 to Subsection A of this section, the district, working with the department, shall publish the information on the sunshine 21 portal. 22 С. The middle Rio Grande conservancy district shall 23 have a link to the sunshine portal on its web site." 24

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
