RELATING TO STATE GOVERNMENT; EXPANDING THE DEFINITION OF "STATE AGENCY" IN THE SUNSHINE PORTAL TRANSPARENCY ACT TO INCLUDE ANY BRANCH OF STATE GOVERNMENT; REQUIRING THE DIRECTORY OF STATE EMPLOYEE POSITIONS IN THE SUNSHINE PORTAL TO INCLUDE IDENTIFICATION BY NAME; PROVIDING EXCEPTIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 10-16D-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 2, as amended) is amended to read:

"10-16D-2. DEFINITIONS.--As used in the Sunshine Portal

- "contract" means an agreement with a state
- (1) the rendition of services, including

8	school;
9	[G.] <u>F.</u> "revenue" means:
10	(1) for a state agency, money received by the
11	state agency and deposited into the general fund or another
12	state fund. "Revenue" includes money from taxes, fines, fees,
13	royalties, federal funds and other sources but does not include
14	money deposited into a state suspense fund; or
15	(2) for a local education provider, all money
16	received by the local education provider, including federal and
17	state grants, state distributions, property tax revenues and

SECTION 2. Section 10-16D-3 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 3, as amended) is amended to read:

"10-16D-3. SUNSHINE PORTAL--DEPARTMENT DUTIES.--

- A. The department, with the department of finance and administration, shall develop, operate and maintain a single internet web site that is free, user-friendly, searchable and accessible to the public, known as the "sunshine portal", to host the state's financial information for the purpose of governmental transparency and accountability to taxpayers.
- B. No later than October 1, 2010, the department shall create the architecture and the information exchange process for the collection and electronic publication of the state's financial information.
- C. No later than July 1, 2011, the sunshine portal shall be available for public access and include updated information as required by Subsection D of this section.
- D. The sunshine portal shall provide, at a minimum, access to the following information:
- (1) the state's cash balances by account or fund;
- (2) a monthly summary of the state's investment accounts;

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1	(3) annual operating budgets for each state
2	agency with monthly expenditures by category;
3	(4) contracts that a state agency enters into
4	for the lease, sale or development of state land and state
5	contracts that have a total contract price of more than twenty
6	thousand dollars (\$20,000), naming the recipient of the
7	contract, the purpose of the contract and the amounts expended;
8	(5) the revenue that the state received in the
9	preceding month by source, such as type of tax, fee, fine,
10	administrative fee or other collection category;
11	(6) special appropriations received outside

14	(7) approved budget adjustment requests by
15	state agency and affected budget category;
16	(8) quarterly consensus revenue estimates;

 $\lceil \frac{(21)}{21} \rceil$ (20) additional information, as required by rule of the department of finance and administration, that will assist the public in understanding state government operations and the use of taxpayer dollars.

- Ε. State agencies shall provide updated financial information as frequently as possible but at least monthly.
- F. The department shall update the web site as new information is received but at least monthly, include information from the previous month or year, where relevant, for comparison purposes and maintain the web site as the primary source of public information about the activity of the state government."

SECTION 3. Section 10-16D-5 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2010, Chapter 34, Section 5) is amended to read:

"10-16D-5. PROTECTION OF CONFIDENTIAL INFORMATION--AGENCY DISCRETION TO EXCLUDE NAMES FROM THE EMPLOYEE DIRECTORY .--

B. Notwithstanding the requirements of Sections
10-16D-3 and 10-16D-6 NMSA 1978, a state agency or local
education provider may exclude the name of an employee from its
directory of all employee positions if it is determined by the
state agency or local education provider that publishing the
name would endanger the employee's personal safety or the
safety of the public. The state agency shall include in the
rules the factors to be used in determining whether to exclude
the names of certain employees from the directory."

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.--The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2013.

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
