B. As used in this section, "credentialing" means
the process that a health maintenance organization uses for
assessing and validating the qualifications of a provider.
"Credentialing" does not mean the peer review or qualifications
review process that a health care facility undertakes when
granting or reviewing a provider's practice privileges with
respect to that health care facility."
