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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 9-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004,
16	Chapter 25, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"9-4A-4. DEPARTMENT CREATEDThe "cultural affairs
18	department" is created in the executive branch. The department
19	is a cabinet department and includes the following divisions:
20	A. the administrative services division;
21	B. the arts division;
22	C. the historic preservation division;
23	D. the library division;
24	E. the Hispanic cultural division;
25	F. the farm and ranch heritage museum division;
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1	G. the natural history and science museum division;
2	H. the museum of space history division;
3	I. the museum resources division;
4	J. the veterans museum division; and
5	K. the following divisions that make up the museum
6	of New Mexico:
7	(1) the palace of the governors state history
8	museum division;
9	(2) the New Mexico museum of art division;
10	(3) the museum of Indian arts and culture
11	division;
12	(4) the museum of international folk art
13	division;
14	(5) the [archaeological services] archaeology
15	division; and
16	(6) the state [ <del>monuments</del> ] <u>historic sites</u>
17	division."
18	SECTION 2. Section 9-4A-17 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2004,
19	Chapter 25, Section 17) is amended to read:
20	"9-4A-17. STATE [MONUMENTS] <u>HISTORIC SITES</u> DIVISION
21	CREATEDBOARD OF REGENTS
22	A. The "state [ <del>monuments</del> ] <u>historic sites</u> division"
23	is created in the cultural affairs department. The division
24	shall manage the state's [ <del>monuments</del> ] <u>historic sites</u> , including:
25	(1) Coronado [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic site</u> ;
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1	(2) Jemez [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic site</u> ;
2	(3) Fort Selden [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic</u>
3	<u>site</u> ;
4	(4) <u>Bosque Redondo memorial and</u> Fort Sumner
5	[ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic site</u> ;
6	(5) Lincoln [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic site</u> ;
7	(6) El Camino Real [ <del>international heritage</del>
8	center; and] historic trail interpretive center;
9	(7) Fort Stanton historic site; and
10	[ <del>(7) the</del> ] <u>(8)</u> Taylor Reynolds Barela Mesilla
11	[ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic site</u> .
12	B. The [state monuments] state's historic sites
13	shall operate under the imprimatur of the museum of New Mexico.
14	The museum of New Mexico board of regents shall exercise
15	trusteeship over [ <del>the</del> ] state [ <del>monuments</del> ] <u>historic sites</u> .
16	C. The director of the division shall meet the
17	following minimum qualifications:
18	(1) hold a bachelor's or higher degree in a
19	discipline related to the function of the division; and
20	(2) have significant experience in the
21	management and operation of an organization similar to the
22	division.
23	D. The director shall be appointed by the secretary
24	of cultural affairs from a list of no less than three names
25	provided by the museum of New Mexico board of regents."
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1	SECTION 3. Section 18-3-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1975,
2	Chapter 264, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
3	"18-3-1. MUSEUM OF NEW MEXICO ESTABLISHEDLOCATION
4	PROPERTY
5	A. The "museum of New Mexico" is established. All
6	properties, real or personal, now held for museum purposes and
7	all properties, real or personal, that may be acquired for
8	museum purposes at any time in the future shall be under
9	the control of the museum board of regents of the museum of New
10	Mexico.
11	B. The museum of New Mexico consists of:
12	(1) the palace of the governors state history
13	museum;
14	(2) the New Mexico museum of art;
15	(3) the museum of Indian arts and culture;
16	(4) the museum of international folk art;
17	(5) [ <del>archaeological services</del> ] <u>the archaeology</u>
18	division; and
19	(6) the state [monuments] <u>historic sites</u> :
20	(a) Coronado [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic</u>
21	<u>site</u> ;
22	(b) Jemez [ <del>state monument</del> ] <u>historic</u>
23	<u>site</u> ;
24	(c) Fort Selden [ <del>state monument</del> ]
25	<u>historic site</u> ;
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1 (d) Bosque Redondo memorial and Fort 2 Sumner [state monument] historic site; 3 (e) Lincoln [state monument] historic 4 site; El Camino Real [international 5 (f) heritage center; and] historic trail interpretive center; 6 7 (g) Fort Stanton historic site; and 8 [(g) the] (h) Taylor Reynolds Barela 9 Mesilla [state monument] historic trail interpretive center." SECTION 4. Section 18-4-6 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1949, 10 Chapter 138, Section 5, as amended) is amended to read: 11 12 "18-4-6. LINCOLN [MONUMENT] HISTORIC SITE--STATE [MONUMENTS] HISTORIC SITES DIVISION--POWERS AND DUTIES.--The 13 14 state [monuments] historic sites division of the cultural affairs department shall be entrusted with the protection and 15 preservation of the old Lincoln county courthouse. The [state 16 17 monuments] historic sites division shall: A. maintain and operate the [monument] historic 18 19 site as a [memorial and] state museum of old Lincoln county 20 [shall have power to]; B. acquire and hold real estate in the name of the 21 state [and to]; 22 C. act in cooperation with the federal government 23 or any of its agencies in preserving the [monument] historic 24 25 <u>site;</u> and [<del>shall have power to</del>] .191019.1SA

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<u>D.</u> accept gifts, grants and donations from any person, firm, corporation, agency or any group of persons for the collections of the museum or the maintenance and operation of the [monument] <u>historic site</u>."

SECTION 5. Section 18-6-17 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1973, Chapter 16, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"18-6-17. DESIGNATION OF STATE [MONUMENTS] HISTORIC SITES--RESERVATION OF LANDS FOR [MONUMENT] HISTORIC SITE CARE AND MANAGEMENT. -- The governor is authorized, upon the recommendation of the committee and the board of regents of the museum of New Mexico, to declare by public proclamation that any cultural property situated on lands owned or controlled by the state shall be a state [monument] historic site and may reserve as a part thereof such parcels of land as may be necessary for the proper care and management of the cultural property to be protected. In the case of proposed state [monuments] historic sites situated on state trust lands, the federal laws granting same shall be complied with. Any such [monument] historic site shall be administered by the [museum] state historic sites division of the [office of] cultural affairs department in accordance with the provisions of Section 18-6-6 NMSA 1978."

SECTION 6. Section 28-13A-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991, Chapter 93, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:

"28-13A-1. SPECIAL RECREATION AND MUSEUM PRIVILEGES.-.191019.1SA

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1 On the federally designated legal holiday known Α. 2 as "Veterans' Day", any New Mexico resident, who provides satisfactory proof that the resident is currently serving or 3 has served in the armed forces of the United States, and the 4 resident's spouse and dependent children, shall be entitled to: 5 free use of any state park or recreation 6 (1)7 area operated by the state parks division of the energy, 8 minerals and natural resources department, including the 9 waiving of all admittance, camping, permit or other user fees 10 or charges; and free general admission to any state museum (2) 11 12 or [monument] historic site. The governing boards of state museums and 13 Β. 14 [monuments] historic sites shall waive general museum and [monument] historic site admission fees for fifty percent or 15 more disabled veterans residing in the state. Proof of 16 disability satisfactory to the governing boards of the state 17 museums and [monuments] historic sites is required to obtain 18 19 the privileges pursuant to this subsection." 20 - 7 -21 22 23 24 25

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
