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1 Employing social workers in every high-poverty public worker. 2 school shall be phased in over a three-year period as determined by department rule as follows: 3 effective with the 2013-2014 school year, 4 (1) one-third of New Mexico's high-poverty public schools shall 5 employ a social worker; 6 7 (2) effective with the 2014-2015 school year, two-thirds of New Mexico's high-poverty public schools shall 8 9 employ a social worker; and effective with the 2015-2016 school year, 10 (3) every New Mexico high-poverty public school shall employ a 11 12 social worker. C. The department may develop exceptions to the 13 requirement that every high-poverty public school in New Mexico 14 shall employ a social worker for small rural public school 15 districts with a MEM of 200 or less." 16 **SECTION 2.** APPROPRIATION. -- Three million dollars 17 18 (\$3,000,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the 19 public education department for expenditure in fiscal year 2014 20 for the purpose of implementing the requirement that every high-poverty public school shall employ a licensed social 21 worker.
