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| 14 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO: |
| 15 | SECTION 1. Section 22-10A-11 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2003, |
| 16 | Chapter 153, Section 42, as amended) is amended to read: |
| 17 | "22-10A-11. LEVEL THREE LICENSURETRACKS FOR TEACHERS, |
| 18 | COUNSELORS AND SCHOOL ADMINISTRATORS |
| 19 | A. A level three-A license is a nine-year license |
| 20 | granted to a teacher or counselor who meets the qualifications |
| 21 | for that level and who annually demonstrates instructional |
| 22 | leader competencies. If a level three-A teacher or counselor |
| 23 | does not demonstrate essential competency in a given school |
| 24 | year, the school district shall provide the teacher <u>or</u> |
| 25 | counselor with additional professional development and peer |
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intervention during the following school year. If by the end of that school year the teacher <u>or counselor</u> fails to demonstrate essential competency, a school district may choose not to contract with the teacher to teach in the classroom <u>or</u> with the counselor.

The department shall grant a level three-A 6 Β. 7 license to an applicant who has been a level two teacher for at 8 least three years and holds a post-baccalaureate degree or 9 national board for professional teaching standards certification; demonstrates instructional leader competence as 10 required by the department and verified by the local 11 12 superintendent through the highly objective uniform statewide standard of evaluation; and meets other qualifications for the 13 14 license.

C. With the adoption by the department of a highly objective uniform statewide standard of evaluation for level three-A teachers <u>or counselors</u>, the minimum salary for a level three-A teacher <u>or counselor</u> for a standard nine and one-half month contract shall be as follows:

(1) for the 2003-2004 school year, thirty
thousand dollars (\$30,000);

(2) for the 2004-2005 school year, thirty-five thousand dollars (\$35,000);

(3) for the 2005-2006 school year, forty
thousand dollars (\$40,000);

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1 (4) for the 2006-2007 school year, 2 forty-five thousand dollars (\$45,000); and for the 2007-2008 school year, fifty 3 (5) thousand dollars (\$50,000). 4 A level three-B license is a nine-year license 5 D. granted to a school administrator who meets the qualifications 6 7 for that level. Licenses may be renewed upon satisfactory annual demonstration of instructional leader and administrative 8 9 competency. Ε. The department shall grant a level three-B 10 license to an applicant who: 11 12 (1) holds a level two license and meets the requirements for a level three-A license or who holds a current 13 level two teacher's license and, for at least four years, has 14 held the highest-ranked counselor license as provided in 15 Chapter 22, Article 10A NMSA 1978 and rules promulgated by the 16 department; 17 holds a post-baccalaureate degree or 18 (2) national board for professional teaching standards 19 20 certification; has satisfactorily completed department-(3) 21 approved courses in administration and a department-approved 22 administration apprenticeship program; and 23 demonstrates instructional leader (4) 24 competence required by the department and verified by the local 25 .193098.1 - 3 -

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1 superintendent through the highly objective uniform statewide standard of evaluation. 2

Beginning with the 2007-2008 school year, the F. minimum annual salary for a level three-B school principal or assistant school principal shall be fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) multiplied by the applicable responsibility factor.

By the beginning of the 2008-2009 school year, G. the department shall adopt a highly objective uniform statewide 8 standard of evaluation, which includes data sources linked to 9 10 student achievement and educational plan for student success progress, for level three-B school principals and assistant 12 school principals and rules for the implementation of that evaluation system linked to the level of responsibility at each school level."

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
