

1 A MEMORIAL

2 REQUESTING THAT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW MEXICO CENTER FOR  
3 EDUCATION POLICY RESEARCH APPOINT A TRUANCY AND DROPOUT  
4 PREVENTION TASK FORCE AS AN INITIATIVE TO DEVELOP  
5 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PREVENTING TRUANCY AND EARLY WITHDRAWAL  
6 FROM SCHOOL.

8 WHEREAS, during the 2011-2012 school year, fifty-one  
9 thousand thirty-four public school students in the state were  
10 habitually truant; and

11 WHEREAS, the state's racial and ethnic minority student  
12 population is overrepresented among truant youth, just as it  
13 is in the juvenile and adult criminal justice systems; and

14 WHEREAS, truancy may increase students' chances of  
15 becoming involved in the juvenile justice system and becoming  
16 part of a school-to-prison pipeline resulting in a lifetime  
17 of incarceration; and

18 WHEREAS, there is a strong correlation between truancy  
19 and:

- 20 A. low reading and mathematics proficiency;  
21 B. suicidal thoughts and attempts; and  
22 C. illicit drug and alcohol abuse, sexual behavior  
23 and teen pregnancy; and

24 WHEREAS, substantial truancy is a strong predictor of  
25 dropping out of school; and

1           WHEREAS, financial outcomes for people who exhibit  
2 substantial truancy and drop out of school typically are  
3 poor; and

4           WHEREAS, the salary of a resident who dropped out of  
5 school averages sixteen thousand eight hundred dollars  
6 (\$16,800) per year, which is forty-six percent less than the  
7 average high school graduate earns and one hundred fifty  
8 percent less than the average college graduate earns; and

9           WHEREAS, long-term outcomes for people who drop out of  
10 school typically are poor; and

11           WHEREAS, people who drop out of school are more likely  
12 than their peers who graduate to live in poverty, receive  
13 public assistance, be in poor health and become single  
14 parents with children who also drop out of school; and

15           WHEREAS, more than two-thirds of inmates at state  
16 prisons lack a high school diploma;

17           NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE  
18 STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the university of New Mexico center  
19 for education policy research be requested to appoint a task  
20 force, to be chaired by the director of the university of New  
21 Mexico center for education policy research and to include  
22 members who represent local school districts, the public  
23 education department, the legislative education study  
24 committee, the legislative finance committee, the children,  
25 youth and families department, the children's court divisions

1 or probation services offices of district courts, district  
2 attorneys' offices, local law enforcement agencies, the  
3 corrections department and the workforce solutions  
4 department; and

5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force:

6 A. develop and recommend multi-agency coordinated  
7 and cooperative strategies to keep students in school and to  
8 prevent truancy and early withdrawal from school;

9 B. develop and recommend measures for schools and  
10 school districts to use in identifying the primary sources of  
11 a student's truancy problem and ways to address the sources;

12 C. develop and recommend best practices for  
13 encouraging student engagement in school;

14 D. recommend and promote truancy and early  
15 withdrawal prevention in ways that do not lead to arrest or  
16 incarceration of students;

17 E. recommend professional development and training  
18 for school personnel to engage with students at risk for  
19 truancy and early withdrawal from school; and

20 F. recommend ways for schools, school districts  
21 and the public education department to track, understand and  
22 work toward reducing the incidents of truancy and dropouts,  
23 including maintaining data to:

24 (1) track each student who:

25 (a) is in danger of becoming a habitual SM 72  
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1 truant due to multiple unexcused absences;

2 (b) has become a habitual truant after  
3 accruing ten or more unexcused absences; or

4 (c) is in danger of dropping out of  
5 school; and

6 (2) aggregate demographic data for each  
7 school district's habitual truants, including:

8 (a) race and ethnicity;

9 (b) gender;

10 (c) area of residency;

11 (d) qualification for free and reduced-  
12 fee lunch;

13 (e) reading proficiency scores; and

14 (f) mathematics proficiency scores; and

15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the task force report its  
16 findings and recommendations to the legislative education  
17 study committee and the legislative finance committee no  
18 later than November 30, 2014; and

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be  
20 transmitted to the university of New Mexico center for  
21 education policy research.
