1. On page 3, line 3, strike "10:00" and insert in lieu thereof, "11:00".,

This allows the Sunday alcohol sales to begin at 11:00 a.m. rather than the current 12 noon.

SUMMARY

Synopsis of HRTC Amendment

House Bill 423 amends Section 60-7A-1 of the Liquor Control Act to allow Sunday Sales to begin at 10:00 am; two hours earlier than the noon starting time under the current statute. The bill also cleans up and moves some language from one section to another but does not change intent.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

The RLD notes that fiscal impact for the Alcohol and Gaming Division would be minimal. Permit applications are already being submitted and approved. No additional requirements are foreseen.
