House Joint Memorial 34 requests reauthorization of the Federal Violence Against Women Act of 1994.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The Violence Against Women Act expired more than two years ago but the issue still exists. New Mexico law enforcement identified 21,368 victims of domestic violence in 2011 and 6,219 children who witnessed this violence. New Mexico receives approximately \$1.2 million annually from the Act which may be in jeopardy if the Act is not reauthorized.
