#### SUMMARY

#### Synopsis of Bill

Senate Bill 82 (SB82) appropriates \$400 thousand in general fund revenue in FY14 to the Aging and Long-Term Services Department (ALTSD) for the operation and maintenance of a regional adult daycare center in the Pueblo of Santa Clara.

#### FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

Senate Bill 82 contains a recurring appropriation of \$400 thousand from the general fund. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of FY14 shall revert to the general fund.

For FY14, the LFC budget recommendation for the ALTSD includes an additional \$202.6 thousand in general fund revenue for adult daycare services, and the Executive recommendation includes \$569.4 thousand for the same purpose.

# SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The senior daycare services facility at Santa Clara Pueblo has been built for some time, but lacks operational funding to provide service delivery.

The ALTSD indicates that the department, under the direction of its Indian Area Agency on Aging, currently contracts with the Santa Clara Pueblo to deliver a variety of services to senior citizens.
