SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

This bill amends Section 66-10-4 NMSA 1978 Qualifications of Driver Education to allow individuals with any operator's or chauffeur's license to qualify as an instructor for driver education school (current law requires a valid *New Mexico* operator's or chauffeur's license).

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

None noted.

TECHNICAL ISSUES

The bill does not specify what type of operator's or chauffeur's licenses are permitted which could allow for confusion.

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AMENDMENTS

It may be helpful to specify which particular licenses will serve to qualify a person to be a driver education school instructor. Language similar to the following may help to resolve the ambiguity: C. hold a valid motor vehicle operator's or chauffeur's license issued by any state or foreign jurisdiction.
