- 10. The President (or designee) of the University of New Mexico;
- 11. The President (or designee) of the New Mexico Institute of Mining and Technology;
- 12. The President (or designee) of Sandia National Laboratories;
- 13. The Director (or designee) of Los Alamos National Laboratory;
- 14. A representative from the Association of Commerce and Industry; and
- 15. A representative from the New Mexico Building and Construction Trades Council.

The Jobs Council will report its findings and recommendation to the appropriate Legislative interim committee by November 1, 2013.
