SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

Chaparral is an unincorporated, census-designated place located in Doña Ana and Otero counties and situated next to White Sands Missile Range and Fort Bliss; and is the largest Colonia in New Mexico with a population of 14,631 as of the 2010 federal decennial census. Colonias are communities within 150 miles of the U.S. border lacking adequate infrastructure including a potable water supply, adequate sewage systems and safe housing.
