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SENATE MEMORIAL 62

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A MEMORIAL

REQUESTING NEW MEXICANS TO ESTABLISH, RESPECT AND HONOR A
STUDENT BILL OF RIGHTS.

WHEREAS, students have the right to a learning environment
in which discrimination in all forms is not tolerated by the
administration, school security or students, and in which
students are encouraged to participate in antidiscrimination
and cultural proficiency training that promotes principles of
equality, engages students in a culturally sensitive manner and
supports a culturally sensitive curriculum; and

WHEREAS, students have the right to extracurricular and
after-school programs and the means and support to access them
and to be able to request to form new clubs that fit their
interests because these programs and activities are important
mechanisms through which students prepare for life after high

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1 school, including improving their ability to access higher
2 education and otherwise develop their minds, talents and
3 perspectives; and

4 WHEREAS, students have the right to information, resources
5 and support to prepare them for life after high school and
6 should be encouraged to pursue higher education and not be
7 discouraged based on any discriminatory factors so that
8 students who choose to pursue college have access to college
9 readiness counselors to assist them in their transition into
10 higher education, and students who choose to enter the work
11 force should be prepared, through information, training and job
12 placement assistance, to make that transition; and

13 WHEREAS, students have the right to equitable school and
14 classroom environments, in which classroom sizes are small and
15 buildings and materials are in good condition; in which
16 creative approaches to teaching are encouraged; in which
17 respect and open communication among parents, teachers,
18 community organizations and students are encouraged; in which
19 building strong intergenerational relationships is valued; and
20 in which schools are fully funded in order to achieve these
21 goals; and

22 WHEREAS, students have the right to affordable and
23 nutritious food in the school environment because proper
24 nutrition is essential to the development of physical,
25 emotional and intellectual well-being; and

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1 WHEREAS, students have the right to bilingual education
2 and bilingual after-school programs, to integrated multilingual
3 classrooms and to speak any language while in school so that
4 they can become fluent speakers and thinkers in the languages
5 important to their development as fully rounded human beings
6 who are able to excel in their cultural, familial and economic
7 environments; and

8 WHEREAS, students have the right to a learning environment
9 that is free of cruel and unusual punishment, including the use
10 of excessive force by security; have the rights to freedom of
11 speech and of the press; and have the right to petition and
12 peacefully assemble with the purpose of improving the school,
13 classroom and learning environments; and

14 WHEREAS, students have the right to due process, to be
15 considered innocent until proven guilty and to be free of
16 searches of personal property by security, administration or
17 staff without reasonable cause and to have their parents
18 notified if such searches occur; and

19 WHEREAS, students have the right to schools that seek
20 alternatives to police presence, that are free of immigration
21 enforcement, that are free from the criminalization of youth,
22 that seek alternatives to suspension and expulsion policies and
23 in which students are given a clean slate each year; and

24 WHEREAS, students have the right to access violence- and
25 gang-prevention, peer-based mediation and intervention programs

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1 on campus; and

2 WHEREAS, students have the right and the opportunity to
3 organize themselves and be represented by their peers in
4 important school decision-making processes; and

5 WHEREAS, students have the right to self-representation in
6 district meetings, whether through a committee or a self-
7 started group, without being tokenized or dismissed due to
8 their youth, and they have the right to notification of
9 district and staff meeting times and places and to organize
10 collectively when issues arise that affect the entire student
11 body; and

12 WHEREAS, students have the right to be afforded space to
13 dialogue safely about aspects of their learning experience and
14 to understand how the school budget works and is allocated; and

15 WHEREAS, students have the right to access a copy of the
16 student bill of rights and to seek to amend this document when
17 necessary such that when concluded, those amendments will
18 improve the learning environment;

19 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE
20 OF NEW MEXICO that New Mexicans be requested to establish,
21 respect and honor a student bill of rights; and

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislative education
23 study committee, in consultation with the public education
24 department, be requested to convene a task force of students
25 and student advocates to perform a yearly examination of the

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1 student bill of rights and make recommendations for legislation
2 that will help to realize the aspirations articulated in the
3 bill of rights; and

4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that copies of this memorial be
5 transmitted to the director of the legislative education study
6 committee and the secretary of public education.

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
