SUMMARY

Synopsis of Bill

The House Agriculture and Water Resources Committee substitute for House Bill 165 amends Section 41-4-11 NMSA 1978 of the Tort Claims Act to exclude irrigation and conservancy districts, and their public employees, from the waiver of sovereign immunity in Section 41-4-4 of the Act, under certain circumstances. A district that authorizes a part of its property for use as a public roadway, and the district's employees, would continue to be protected by sovereign immunity, provided that the roadway is operated and maintained by a state agency or local public body pursuant to a written agreement with the district, and provided further that the state agency or local public body is otherwise subject to liability under the Tort Claims Act.

FISCAL IMPLICATIONS

No fiscal impacts were identified.

SIGNIFICANT ISSUES

The AGO raises the question why under similar circumstances other special districts created by law are not specifically excluded from the waiver of immunity in the same manner irrigation and conservancy districts are excluded for damages resulting from bodily injury, wrongful death or property damage caused by the negligence of their employees while acting within the scope of their duties.
