WHEREAS, the vision of a high-quality public education system encompasses well-maintained, inspiring classrooms and small class sizes to encourage and foster a strong student-educator relationship; and

WHEREAS, the success of this vision must acknowledge poverty as a systemic issue and requires broad policy action and courageous leadership aimed at promoting fair employment with livable wages and increased access to vital services;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE

STATE OF NEW MEXICO that the community vision and the need for a high-quality, inclusive and equitable public education system in New Mexico be recognized; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the legislature renew its commitment to New Mexico students, families, educators and communities to focus resources and craft policies in a manner that moves New Mexico toward the shared vision of a highquality public education for all; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a copy of this memorial be transmitted to keep the promise for New Mexico's future.
