21	A. The state seal of bilingualism-biliteracy on a
22	New Mexico diploma of excellence certifies that the recipient
23	is proficient for meaningful use in college, a career or to
24	meet a local community language need in a world language other
25	than English. The graduate's high school transcript shall also

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1 indicate that the graduate received the state seal on the 2 graduate's New Mexico diploma of excellence. The department shall adopt rules to establish 3 Β. the criteria for students to earn a seal of bilingualism-4 5 biliteracy, to include: the number of units of credit in a 6 (1)language other than English, including content courses taught 7 8 in a language other than English, English language arts or 9 English as a second language for English language learners; (2) passage of state assessments in a world 10 language other than English or English language arts for 11 12 English language learners; in the case of tribal languages, (3) 13 certification of tribal language proficiency in consultation 14 with individual tribes and adherence to processes and criteria 15 defined by that tribe as appropriate for determining 16 17 proficiency in its language; demonstrated proficiency in one or more (4) 18 19 languages other than English through one of the following 20 methods: score three or higher on an advanced (a) 21 placement examination for a language other than English; 22 (b) score four or higher on an 23 international baccalaureate examination for a higher-level 24 25 language other than English course; .196300.2

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1 (c) score proficient on a national 2 assessment of language proficiency in a language other than 3 English; or (d) provide presentations, interviews, 4 essays, portfolios and other alternative processes that 5 demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English. 6 7 C. In establishing the criteria for awarding the state seal of bilingualism-biliteracy, the department shall 8 establish and consult with a task force of stakeholders that 9 represent language experts, including: 10 Indian nations, tribes and pueblos; (1)11 12 (2) teachers of world languages; endorsed teachers of bilingual (3) 13 multicultural education; 14 directors of bilingual education; (4) 15 (5) statewide organizations representing 16 language educators, bilingual education, dual language 17 education and teachers of English as a second language; 18 university professors of world languages, 19 (6) 20 heritage languages, Indian languages and bilingual education; and 21 (7) representatives of the state bilingual 22 advisory council, the Indian education advisory council and the 23 Hispanic education advisory council." 24 - 3 -25 .196300.2

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
