17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 30-16-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963,
19	Chapter 303, Section 16-1, as amended) is amended to read:
20	"30-16-1. LARCENY
21	A. Larceny consists of the stealing of anything of
22	value that belongs to another.
23	B. Whoever commits larceny when the value of the
24	property stolen is two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) or less is
25	guilty of a petty misdemeanor.

1 C. Whoever commits larceny when the value of the 2 property stolen is over two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) but not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) is guilty of a 3 4 misdemeanor.

Whoever commits larceny when the value of the D. property stolen is over five hundred dollars (\$500) but not 7 more than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500) is guilty of a fourth degree felony. 8

Whoever commits larceny when the value of the 9 Ε. property stolen is over two thousand five hundred dollars 10 (\$2,500) but not more than twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is 11 12 guilty of a third degree felony.

F. Whoever commits larceny when the value of the property stolen is over twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000) is guilty of a second degree felony.

Whoever commits larceny when the property of G. value stolen is livestock is guilty of a third degree felony regardless of its value.

Whoever commits larceny when the property of н. value stolen is a firearm is guilty of a fourth degree felony when its value is less than two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500).

I. Whoever commits larceny of telecommunication or utility cable or hardware, or of components associated with a railroad signal system, that directly results in an outage is .195352.1 - 2 -
