"community health worker" means a public health worker who applies an understanding of the experience, language 13 and culture of the populations that the individual serves and 14 who provides direct services aimed at optimizing individual and 15 family health outcomes, including: 16 informal and motivational counseling and (1)17 education; 18 (2) interventions to maximize social supports; 19 (3) care coordination; 20 facilitation of access to health care and (4) 21 social services; 22 health screenings; and (5) 23 other services that the secretary defines (6) 24 by rule; 25 .196538.1 - 2 -

SECTION 5. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] REQUIREMENTS FOR CERTIFICATION--RECERTIFICATION.--

A. An applicant for certification or recertification shall submit an application for registration in .196538.1

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1 accordance with department rules. 2 A certified community health worker shall carry Β. 3 the certified community health worker's certificate and present 4 it upon request. 5 C. The department shall issue certificates that shall be valid for two years to certified community health 6 7 workers. A certificate may be recertified in accordance with department rules. 8 9 SECTION 6. [NEW MATERIAL] USE OF CERTIFIED COMMUNITY HEALTH WORKER DESIGNATION -- UNAUTHORIZED PRACTICE .--10 Α. In order to use the title "certified community 11 12 health worker", the initials "CCHW" or other designation indicating that the individual is a certified community health 13 worker, an individual shall be certified pursuant to the 14 provisions of the Community Health Workers Act. 15 Β. To ensure compliance with the provisions of the 16 bracketed material] = delete Community Health Workers Act or any rule that the secretary has 17 adopted and promulgated pursuant to that act, the department 18 may issue cease-and-desist orders to persons violating the 19 provisions of the Community Health Workers Act. 20 A certified community health worker shall engage C. 21 only in those activities authorized pursuant to the Community 22 Health Workers Act and by rules adopted and promulgated 23 pursuant to that act. While engaging in practice as a 24 certified community health worker, an individual shall not 25 .196538.1

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1 engage in or perform any act or service for which another 2 professional certificate, license or other legal authority is 3 required. Nothing in this section shall be construed to 4 prevent or restrict the practice, service or activities of any 5 individual simultaneously certified as a community health worker and licensed, certified, registered or otherwise legally 6 7 authorized in the state to engage in the practice of another 8 profession if that individual does not, while engaged in the 9 authorized practice of another profession, use any name, title, the initials "CCHW" or other designation indicating that the 10 individual is a certified community health worker. 11

SECTION 7. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CRIMINAL HISTORY SCREENING.--

A. The department is authorized to obtain the criminal history records of applicants and to exchange fingerprint data directly with the federal bureau of investigation, the department of public safety and any other law enforcement agency or organization. The department shall require fingerprinting of applicants for the purposes of this section.

B. The secretary shall adopt and promulgate rules

(1) require criminal background checks for applicants;

(2) identify the information from a criminalbackground check that may form the basis of a denial,

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1 suspension or revocation of certification or any other 2 disciplinary action; and

(3) otherwise carry out the provisions of this section.

C. The department shall comply with applicable confidentiality requirements of the department of public safety and the federal bureau of investigation regarding the dissemination of criminal background check information.

D. An applicant whose certification or recertification is denied, suspended or revoked, or who is otherwise disciplined based on information obtained in a criminal history background check, shall be entitled to review the information obtained pursuant to this section and to appeal the decision pursuant to rules promulgated by the department.

E. The applicant shall bear any costs associated with ordering or conducting criminal background checks.

F. The provisions of the Criminal Offender Employment Act shall govern any consideration of criminal records required or permitted by the Community Health Workers Act.

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
