18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
19	SECTION 1. AUTHORIZATION OF QUALIFYING WATER PROJECTS
20	Pursuant to the provisions of Section 72-4A-9 NMSA 1978, the
21	legislature authorizes the New Mexico finance authority to make
22	loans or grants from the water project fund to the following
23	qualifying entities for the following qualifying water projects
24	on terms and conditions established by the water trust board
25	and the New Mexico finance authority:

9	SECTION 2. A new section of the Water Project Finance Act									
10	is enacted to read:									
11	"[<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] AUTHORIZATION LIMITATIONSMoney in the									
12	water project fund that has not been obligated shall not be									
13	used to fund water projects that were authorized in a									
14	legislative session prior to the most recent regular									
15	legislative session but not funded by the authority; provided									
16	that such projects previously authorized by the legislature may									
17	be authorized again."									
18	SECTION 3. Section 72-4A-4 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001,									
19	Chapter 164, Section 4, as amended) is amended to read:									
20	"72-4A-4. WATER TRUST BOARD CREATED									
21	A. The "water trust board" is created. The board									
22	is composed of the following [sixteen] <u>fifteen</u> members:									
23	(1) the state engineer or the state engineer's									
24	designee;									
25	(2) the secretary of finance and									
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1 administration or the secretary's designee; 2 the executive director of the New Mexico (3) 3 finance authority or the executive director's designee; (4) the secretary of environment or the 4 5 secretary's designee; 6 (5) the secretary of energy, minerals and 7 natural resources or the secretary's designee; 8 [(6) the director of the department of game 9 and fish or the director's designee; (7) the director of the New Mexico department 10 of agriculture or the director's designee;] 11 12 [(8)] (6) the executive director of the New Mexico municipal league or the executive director's designee; 13 [(9)] (7) the executive director of the New 14 Mexico association of counties or the executive director's 15 designee; 16 [(10) five] (8) six public members appointed 17 by the [governor and confirmed by the senate and] New Mexico 18 legislative council who represent: 19 (a) the environmental community; 20 an irrigation or conservancy (b) 21 district [that uses surface water]; 22 (c) [an irrigation or conservancy 23 district that uses ground water] the agricultural community; 24 (d) acequia water users; [and] 25 .196733.4 - 6 -

2	districts; <u>and</u>									
3	(f) water associations organized under									
4	the Sanitary Projects Act, Laws 1947, Chapter 206, Laws 1949,

6	[(11)] <u>(9)</u> one public member appointed by the									
7	Indian affairs commission; and									
8	[(12)] <u>(10) one representative of the Navajo</u>									
9	Nation who lives in New Mexico appointed by the president of									
10	the Navajo Nation [or the president's designee].									
11	B. The chair of the board shall be elected by a									
12	quorum of the board members. The board shall meet at the call									
13	of the chair or whenever three members submit a request in									
14	writing to the chair, but not less often than once each									
15	calendar year. A majority of members constitutes a quorum for									
16	the transaction of business. The affirmative vote of at least									
17	a majority of a quorum present shall be necessary for an action									
18	to be taken by the board.									
19	C. Each public member of the board [appointed by									
20	the governor] shall be appointed to a four-year term. To									
21	provide for staggered terms, two of the initially [governor-									
22	appointed] appointed public members shall be appointed for									
23	terms of two years and three members for terms of four years.									
24	Thereafter, all [governor-appointed] public members shall be									
25	appointed for four-year terms. Vacancies <u>in public member</u>									
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<u>positions</u> shall be filled by appointment by the [governor] <u>New</u>
 <u>Mexico legislative council</u> for the remainder of the unexpired
 term.

D. Public members of the board shall be reimbursed for attending meetings of the board as provided for nonsalaried public officers in the Per Diem and Mileage Act and shall receive no other compensation, perquisite or allowance.

8 E. Public members of the board are appointed public
9 officials of the state while carrying out their duties and
10 activities under the Water Project Finance Act.

F. The public members of the water trust board on July 1, 2014 shall finish out the terms for which they were appointed. If a vacancy occurs in a public member's term after July 1, 2014, the New Mexico legislative council shall fill the vacancy by appointment of a qualified person for the remainder of the term."

SECTION 4. Section 72-4A-10 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001, Chapter 164, Section 10) is amended to read:

"72-4A-10. REPORT TO LEGISLATURE.--The board shall report to the legislature no later than October 1 of each calender year the total expenditures from the water project fund <u>and the</u> <u>acequia project fund</u>, their purposes, an analysis of the accomplishments of the expenditures and recommendations for legislative action."
