| 21 | A. The "science early education program" is created |
| 22 | as a five-year pilot project that is based on three-year |
| 23 | student cohorts and that incorporates hands-on, age-appropriate |
| 24 | physics, computer programming and chemistry education into the |
| 25 | sixth through eighth grade curricula. The purpose of the |

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<u>underscored material = new</u> [bracketed material] = delete science early education program is to enhance students' academic performance in science and mathematics.

B. The department shall administer the science early education program and shall contract with an organization that provides professional development and teaching materials for teachers to introduce physics education into the sixth through eighth grade curricula, computer programming into the seventh and eighth grade curricula and chemistry into the eighth grade curriculum.

C. The science early education program is designated for high-poverty public schools. For the purposes of the science early education program, "high-poverty public school" means a public school in which eighty-five percent or more of the students are eligible for free or reduced-fee lunch at the time the public school applies for the program.

D. School districts may apply on behalf of their schools on a form and in a manner as provided by the department for a grant from the science early education fund. The department shall select for participation in the program four schools that are based in regions in the state that are distinct from one another in their locations and population density. An approved school shall provide one-half of the funding for the program.

E. Students participating in the science early education program shall be evaluated at the beginning of the .196006.1

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program, and the students' progress shall be measured through standardized assessments in science and mathematics at the end of grades six, seven and eight. 3

The department shall establish reporting and F. evaluation requirements for participating schools, including student and program assessments. The department shall provide interim and final reports annually to the legislature and the governor on the efficacy of the science early education program."

SECTION 2. A new section of the Public School Code is 10 enacted to read: 11

"[NEW MATERIAL] SCIENCE EARLY EDUCATION FUND--CREATED.--The "science early education fund" is created in the state treasury. The fund consists of appropriations, gifts, grants, donations and income from investment of the fund. The department shall administer the fund, and money in the fund is appropriated to the department to carry out the purposes of the science early education program. The department shall seek public and private grants and donations for the science early education program. Grants and donations shall be deposited in the fund. Money from a grant or donation shall be expended in accordance with the terms of that grant or donation. Unless otherwise specified by the terms of a grant or donation, the balance in the fund at the end of the program shall revert to the general fund. The department may expend up to ten percent .196006.1

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of the fund to administer the program. Expenditures from the fund shall be by warrants of the secretary of finance and administration drawn pursuant to vouchers signed by the secretary of public education or the secretary's authorized representative."

SECTION 3. APPROPRIATION.--One hundred ten thousand dollars (\$110,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the science early education fund for expenditure in fiscal years 2014 through 2019 to carry out the provisions of the science early education program. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2019 shall revert to the general fund.

SECTION 4. EMERGENCY.--It is necessary for the public peace, health and safety that this act take effect immediately.

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
