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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. Section 50-11-1 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991,
18	Chapter 244, Section 1) is amended to read:
19	"50-11-1. SHORT TITLE[ <del>This act</del> ] <u>Chapter 50, Article 11</u>
20	<u>NMSA 1978</u> may be cited as the "Employee Privacy Act"."
21	SECTION 2. Section 50-11-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1991,
22	Chapter 244, Section 2) is amended to read:
23	"50-11-2. DEFINITIONSAs used in the Employee Privacy
24	Act:
25	A. "employee" means a person that performs a
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<u>underscored material = new</u> [<del>bracketed material</del>] = delete 1 service for wages or other remuneration under a contract of 2 hire, written or oral, express or implied, and includes a 3 person employed by the state or a political subdivision of the 4 state;

B. "employer" means a person that has one or more
employees and includes an agent of an employer and the state or
a political subdivision of the state; [and]

C. "health care practitioner" means:

11	D. "health care worker" means a person other than a
12	health care practitioner:
13	(1) whose work involves contact with patients;
14	(2) who is employed by a health facility; or
15	(3) who provides wellness, care coordination
16	or disease prevention and management services directly to an
17	<u>insured under a health insurance plan or to an enrollee of a</u>
18	managed care health plan;
19	E. "health facility" means a public hospital,
20	profit or nonprofit private hospital, general or special
21	hospital, outpatient facility, maternity home or shelter, adult
22	daycare facility, nursing home, intermediate care facility,
23	boarding home not under the control of an institution of higher
24	learning, child care center, shelter care home, diagnostic and
25	treatment center, rehabilitation center, infirmary, community
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1	mental health center, residential treatment center, day
2	treatment center, health service organization operating as a
3	freestanding hospice or home health agency and a clinical
4	laboratory that is accredited pursuant to 42 U.S.C. Section
5	263a but that is not a laboratory in a physician's office or in
6	a hospital defined pursuant to 42 U.S.C. Section 1395x; and
7	[ <del>C.</del> ] <u>F.</u> "person" means an individual, sole
8	proprietorship, partnership, corporation, association or any
9	other legal entity."
10	SECTION 3. A new section of the Employee Privacy Act is
11	enacted to read:
12	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] EXEMPTIONThe provisions of the Employee
13	Privacy Act do not apply to an employer of a health care
14	practitioner or of a health care worker who applies for
15	employment or is hired on or after July 1, 2015."
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
