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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
17	SECTION 1. A new section of Chapter 29 NMSA 1978 is
18	enacted to read:
19	"[ <u>NEW MATERIAL</u> ] LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD AUTHORIZED TO ESTABLISH
20	POLICE FORCEQUALIFICATIONS AND AUTHORITYJURISDICTION
21	REPORT TO LEGISLATURE
22	A. A local school board may establish a police
23	force and adopt policies and rules applicable to the police
24	force, including:
25	(1) defining acts that pose a substantial
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1 threat to school safety justifying arrest; 2 defining petty acts of misconduct that (2) 3 should be treated as disciplinary infractions; when to report petty acts of misconduct 4 (3) and misdemeanors to other law enforcement agencies, including: 5 disorderly conduct; 6 (a) 7 (b) interference with the educational process; 8 9 (c) simple assault or battery; theft of less than two hundred fifty 10 (d) dollars (\$250); 11 12 (e) trespassing; and vandalism of property that results 13 (f) in less than five hundred dollars (\$500) in damages; and 14 requiring that disciplinary interactions (4) 15 between students and school police be based on the individual 16 student and the particular circumstances of the student's acts 17 or omissions. 18 19 Β. Each year a school district shall submit a 20 report to the public education department that includes: the number of arrests, citations and (1) 21 referrals to the children, youth and families department that 22 law enforcement officers and other school employees have made 23 for any alleged delinquent act on school property; 24 the offenses for which students were 25 (2) .196282.1 - 2 -

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1 arrested, cited or referred to the children, youth and families 2 department for an alleged delinquent act on school property; 3 and for students arrested, cited or referred (3) 4 to the children, youth and families department for an alleged 5 delinquent act, statistics categorized by offense regarding the 6 7 student's: 8 (a) age; race; 9 (b) gender; and 10 (c) if applicable, special education (d) 11 12 eligibility category. C. The superintendent of a school district, 13 pursuant to authority granted by the local school board, may 14 employ and assign duties to police officers for the school 15 district. 16 Police officers employed by a school district: 17 D. shall be New Mexico certified law (1) 18 enforcement officers; 19 20 (2)shall have the powers of peace officers within the exterior boundaries of the school district; 21 (3) shall at all times while on duty carry 22 commissions of office issued by the local school board; 23 shall be required to participate in (4) 24 ongoing, specialized training that focuses on working 25 .196282.1 - 3 -

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1 appropriately and effectively with children and adolescents, 2 including students with disabilities, with such training to be provided by the school district at no cost to the officers; 3 may enforce all applicable laws on school 4 (5) district property; 5 may enforce all applicable laws within the 6 (6) 7 exterior boundaries of the school district as commissioned by the sheriff of the county in which the school district is 8 9 located: and (7) may make arrests for violations of law, 10 but no arrest is valid unless the arresting police officer is, 11 12 at the time of the arrest, wearing a distinctive: (a) badge issued by the local school 13 14 board and bearing the name of the school district; and uniform prescribed and issued by the (b) 15 local school board. 16 A school district that establishes a police 17 Ε. force shall report to the appropriate interim legislative 18 committee on the operations of the police force, including 19 20 policies, procedures, practices, training programs, discipline of students, school safety and oversight by the local school 21 board and superintendent. The school district shall provide a 22 full report within one year of establishing the police force 23 and, thereafter, upon request of the committee chair. 24 F. As used in this section, "local school board" 25

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means the policy-setting body of a school district." SECTION 2. DELAYED REPEAL.--Section 1 of this act is repealed effective July 1, 2019. SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. -- The effective date of the provisions of this act is July 1, 2014. - 5 -.196282.1

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
