11	RELATING TO HIGHER EDUCATION; ESTABLISHING A SCHOLARSHIP
12	PROGRAM FOR NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARS.

14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
15	SECTION 1. Section 21-1-2 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1970,
16	Chapter 9, Section 1, as amended) is amended to read:
17	"21-1-2. MATRICULATION AND TUITION FEES
18	A. Except as otherwise provided in this section and
19	in Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978, the boards of regents of the
20	university of New Mexico, New Mexico state university, New
21	Mexico highlands university, western New Mexico university,
22	eastern New Mexico university, New Mexico military institute
23	and New Mexico institute of mining and technology shall
24	establish and charge matriculation fees and tuition fees as
25	follows:

1 each student shall be charged a (1) 2 matriculation fee of not less than five dollars (\$5.00) upon 3 enrolling in each institution; each student who is a resident of New 4 (2) 5 Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) a year; 6 7 (3) each student who is not a resident of New Mexico shall be charged a tuition fee of not less than fifty 8 9 dollars (\$50.00) a year; each student shall be charged a tuition 10 (4) fee of not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) for each summer 11 12 session; and each student may be charged a tuition fee 13 (5) for extension courses. 14 Except as otherwise provided in this section and 15 Β. in Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978, the board of regents of northern 16 New Mexico college shall establish and charge each student a 17 matriculation fee and a tuition fee. 18 19 С. The board of regents of each institution may establish and grant gratis scholarships to students who are 20 residents of New Mexico in an amount not to exceed the 21 matriculation fee or tuition and fees, or both. These 22 scholarships are in addition to the lottery tuition 23 scholarships authorized in Section 21-1-4.3 NMSA 1978 and shall 24 be granted to the full extent of available funds before lottery 25 .196014.1

1 tuition scholarships are granted. The number of scholarships 2 established and granted pursuant to this subsection shall not 3 exceed three percent of the preceding fall semester enrollment in each institution and shall not be established and granted 4 5 for summer sessions. The president of each institution shall select and recommend to the board of regents of the 6 7 institution, as recipients of scholarships, students who 8 possess good moral character and satisfactory initiative, 9 scholastic standing and personality. Beginning with the fall semester of 2010, a minimum of one-half of the gratis 10 scholarships established and granted by each board of regents 11 12 each year shall be granted on the basis of financial need, and beginning with the fall semester of 2011, a minimum of two-13 14 thirds of the gratis scholarships established and granted by each board of regents each year shall be granted on the basis 15 of financial need. 16

D. The board of regents or governing board of each institution set out in this subsection may establish and grant, in addition to those scholarships provided for in Subsection C of this section, athletic scholarships for tuition and fees. In no event shall the board of regents of any institution be allowed to award scholarships for tuition and fees for more than the number of athletic scholarships set out in this subsection and in no event shall more than seventy-five percent of the scholarships granted be for out-of-state residents: .196014.1

1 (1) the board of regents of the university of 2 New Mexico may grant up to two hundred ninety-three athletic 3 scholarships; (2) the board of regents of New Mexico state 4 5 university may grant up to two hundred seventy athletic scholarships; 6 7 (3) the boards of regents of New Mexico highlands university, eastern New Mexico university and western 8 9 New Mexico university may each grant up to one hundred forty

athletic scholarships; and

(4) the governing board of New Mexico junior college may grant up to fifty-two athletic scholarships.

E. In the event that the number of athletic scholarships exceeds the number of athletic scholarships permitted that institution by regulations and bylaws of the national collegiate athletic association or the national association of intercollegiate athletics of which that institution is a member, the appropriate board of regents shall reduce the number of authorized tuition scholarships to comply with association rules and regulations.

F. The board of regents or governing board of each institution set out in Subsection D of this section may establish and grant, in addition to those scholarships provided for in Subsections C and D of this section, national merit scholarships for tuition and fees in the same numbers as the .196014.1

23	be fixed and made payable as directed by the board of regents
24	of each institution, collected by the officers of each
25	institution and accounted for as are other funds of the
