Bill Summary:

HJM 1 resolves that the New Mexico Activities Association (NMAA) (see "Background," below) work with the Public Education Department (PED) to:

- create a statewide Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math (STEM) championship program for all New Mexico middle and high schools;
- develop extracurricular and co-curricular clubs and activities related to STEM;
- provide funding at every public school for a STEM coach.

HJM 1 further resolves that:

- NMAA, PED, school districts, and charter schools work with schools, businesses, and field experts to provide quality control for STEM extracurricular and co-curricular programs;
- NMAA and PED report their progress on the STEM initiative to the Legislative Education Study Committee (LESC) by December 1, 2015; and
- copies of HJM 1 be transmitted to the director of NMAA, the Secretary of PED, and the Chair of the LESC.

Among its provisions, HJM 1 states that:

- an article in *Education Policy Analysis Archives* shows that students who participate in science and math clubs have higher grade point averages in related classes and are three times more likely to choose STEM majors in college; and
- the NMAA supports the New Mexico Science Olympiad, the New Mexico Science and Engineering Fair, and the Technology Student Association.

Fiscal Impact:

Legislative memorials do not carry appropriations.

For FY 16, HAFC CS/HB 2 & 4, the *General Appropriation Act of 2015*, as passed by the House of Representatives includes a \$2.0 million General Fund appropriation to PED to support a statewide STEM initiative.
