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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. Section 55-2A-529 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992,
19	Chapter 114, Section 84) is amended to read:
20	"55-2A-529. LESSOR'S ACTION FOR THE RENT
21	(1) After default by the lessee under the lease
22	contract of the type described in Section 55-2A-523(1) or
23	55-2A-523(3)(a) NMSA 1978 or, if agreed, after other default by
24	the lessee, if the lessor complies with Subsection (2) of this
25	section, the lessor may recover from the lessee as damages:
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(a) for goods accepted by the lessee and not repossessed by or tendered to the lessor, and for conforming goods lost or damaged within a commercially reasonable time after risk of loss passes to the lessee (Section 55-2A-219 NMSA 1978), (i) accrued and unpaid rent as of the date of entry of judgment in favor of the lessor, (ii) the present value as of the same date of the rent for the then remaining lease term of the lease agreement, and (iii) any incidental damages allowed under Section 55-2A-530 NMSA 1978, less expenses saved in consequence of the lessee's default; and

(b) for goods identified to the lease contract if the lessor is unable after reasonable effort to dispose of them at a reasonable price or the circumstances reasonably indicate that effort will be unavailing, (i) accrued and unpaid rent as of the date of entry of judgment in favor of the lessor, (ii) the present value as of the same date of the rent for the then remaining lease term of the lease agreement, and (iii) any incidental damages allowed under Section 55-2A-530 NMSA 1978, less expenses saved in consequence of the lessee's default.

(2) Except as provided in Subsection (3) of this section, the lessor shall hold for the lessee for the remaining lease term of the lease agreement any goods that have been identified to the lease contract and are in the lessor's control.

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1 The lessor may dispose of the goods at any time (3) 2 before collection of the judgment for damages obtained pursuant to Subsection (1) of this section. If the disposition is 3 before the end of the remaining lease term of the lease 4 agreement, the lessor's recovery against the lessee for damages 5 is governed by Section 55-2A-527 or 55-2A-528 NMSA 1978, and 6 7 the lessor will cause an appropriate credit to be provided against a judgment for damages to the extent that the amount of 8 9 the judgment exceeds the recovery available pursuant to Section 55-2A-527 or 55-2A-528 NMSA 1978. 10 (4) Payment of the judgment for damages obtained 11 12 pursuant to Subsection (1) of this section entitles the lessee to the use and possession of the goods not then disposed of for 13 14 the remaining lease term of and in accordance with the lease agreement. 15 After default by the lessee under the lease (5) 16 contract of the type described in Section 55-2A-523(1) or 17 Section 55-2A-523(3)(a) NMSA 1978 or, if agreed, after other 18 default by the lessee, a lessor who is held not entitled to 19

rent under this section must nevertheless be awarded damages for non-acceptance under Section 55-2A-527 or 55-2A-528 NMSA 1978."

SECTION 2. Section 55-3-415 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992, Chapter 114, Section 140) is amended to read:

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"55-3-415. OBLIGATION OF INDORSER.--

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1 Subject to Subsections (b), (c), [and] (d) and (a) 2 (e) of this section and to Section 55-3-419(d) NMSA 1978, if an instrument is dishonored, an indorser is obliged to pay the 3 amount due on the instrument (i) according to the terms of the 4 instrument at the time it was indorsed or (ii) if the indorser 5 indorsed an incomplete instrument, according to its terms when 6 7 completed, to the extent stated in Sections 55-3-115 and 8 55-3-407 NMSA 1978. The obligation of the indorser is owed to 9 a person entitled to enforce the instrument or to a subsequent indorser who paid the instrument under this section. 10

(b) If an indorsement states that it is made "without recourse" or otherwise disclaims liability of the indorser, the indorser is not liable under Subsection (a) of this section to pay the instrument.

If notice of dishonor of an instrument is (c) required by Section 55-3-503 NMSA 1978 and notice of dishonor complying with that section is not given to an indorser, the liability of the indorser under Subsection (a) of this section is discharged.

(d) If a draft is accepted by a bank after an indorsement is made, the liability of the indorser under Subsection (a) of this section is discharged.

(e) If an indorser of a check is liable under Subsection (a) of this section and the check is not presented for payment, or given to a depositary bank for collection, .198200.1 - 4 -

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within thirty days after the day the indorsement was made, the liability of the indorser under Subsection (a) of this section is discharged."

Section 55-4A-106 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1992, SECTION 3. Chapter 114, Section 202, as amended) is amended to read: "55-4A-106. TIME PAYMENT ORDER IS RECEIVED. --

The time of receipt of a payment order or (a) communication canceling or amending a payment order is determined by the rules applicable to receipt of a notice stated in Section 55-1-202 NMSA 1978. A receiving bank may fix a cut-off time or times on a funds-transfer business day for the receipt and processing of payment orders and communications canceling or amending payment orders. Different cut-off times may apply to payment orders, cancellations or amendments, or to different categories of payment orders, cancellations or amendments. A cut-off time may apply to senders generally or different cut-off times may apply to different senders or categories of payment orders. If a payment order or communication canceling or amending a payment order is received after the close of a funds-transfer business day or after the appropriate cut-off time on a funds-transfer business day, the receiving bank may treat the payment order or communication as received at the opening of the next funds-transfer business day.

If this article refers to an execution date or (b) .198200.1

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payment date or states a day on which a receiving bank is required to take action, and the date or day does not fall on a funds-transfer business day, the next day that is a fundstransfer business day is treated as the date or day stated, unless the contrary is stated in this article."

SECTION 4. Section 55-9-331 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 2001, Chapter 139, Section 51) is amended to read:

(a) Chapter 55, Article 9 NMSA 1978 does not limit the rights of a holder in due course of a negotiable instrument, a holder to which a negotiable document of title has been duly negotiated or a protected purchaser of a security. SECTION 11. Section 56-10-17 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 382, Section 4) is amended to read:

"56-10-17. VALUE.--

A. Value is given for a transfer or an obligation if, in exchange for the transfer or obligation, property is transferred or an antecedent debt is secured or satisfied, but .198200.1

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value does not include an unperformed promise made otherwise than in the ordinary course of the promisor's business to furnish support to the debtor or another person.

For the purposes of Paragraph (2) of Subsection Β. A of Section [5 and Section 6 of the Uniform Fraudulent Transfer Act] 56-10-18 and Section 56-10-19 NMSA 1978, a person gives a reasonably equivalent value if the person acquires an interest of the debtor in an asset pursuant to a regularly conducted, noncollusive foreclosure sale or execution of a power of sale for the acquisition or disposition of the interest of the debtor upon default under a mortgage, deed of trust or security agreement.

A transfer is made for present value if the C. exchange between the debtor and the transferee is intended by them to be contemporaneous and is in fact substantially contemporaneous."

SECTION 12. Section 56-10-18 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 382, Section 5) is amended to read:

"56-10-18. [TRANSFERS FRAUDULENT AS TO PRESENT AND FUTURE CREDITORS] TRANSFER OR OBLIGATION VOIDABLE AS TO PRESENT OR FUTURE CREDITOR .--

A. A transfer made or obligation incurred by a debtor is [fraudulent] voidable as to a creditor, whether the creditor's claim arose before or after the transfer was made or the obligation was incurred, if the debtor made the transfer or .198200.1 - 17 -

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1 incurred the obligation: 2 (1) with actual intent to hinder, delay or 3 defraud any creditor of the debtor; or without receiving a reasonably equivalent 4 (2) value in exchange for the transfer or obligation, and the 5 debtor: 6 7 (a) was engaged or was about to engage in a business or a transaction for which the remaining assets 8 9 of the debtor were unreasonably small in relation to the business or transaction; or 10 (b) intended to incur, or believed or 11 12 reasonably should have believed that [he] the debtor would incur, debts beyond [his] the debtor's ability to pay as they 13 became due. 14 In determining actual intent under Paragraph (1) Β. 15 of Subsection A of this section, consideration may be given, 16 among other factors, to whether: 17 the transfer or obligation was to an (1) 18 19 insider; (2)the debtor retained possession or control 20 of the property transferred after the transfer; 21 the transfer or obligation was disclosed (3) 22 or concealed; 23 before the transfer was made or obligation (4) 24 was incurred, the debtor has been sued or threatened with suit; 25 .198200.1 - 18 -

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1 the transfer was of substantially all the (5) 2 debtor's assets: the debtor absconded; 3 (6) the debtor removed or concealed assets; 4 (7) the value of the consideration received by (8) 5 the debtor was reasonably equivalent to the value of the asset 6 7 transferred or the amount of the obligation incurred; the debtor was insolvent or became 8 (9) 9 insolvent shortly after the transfer was made or the obligation was incurred; 10 (10) the transfer occurred shortly before or 11 12 shortly after a substantial debt was incurred; and the debtor transferred the essential (11)13 assets of the business to a lienor who transferred the assets 14 to an insider of the debtor. 15 C. A creditor making a claim for relief under 16 Subsection A of this section has the burden of proving the 17 elements of the claim for relief by a preponderance of the 18 19 evidence." 20 SECTION 13. Section 56-10-19 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 382, Section 6) is amended to read: 21 "56-10-19. [TRANSFERS FRAUDULENT AS TO PRESENT CREDITORS] 22 TRANSFER OR OBLIGATION VOIDABLE AS TO PRESENT CREDITOR .--23 A transfer made or obligation incurred by a Α. 24 debtor is [fraudulent] voidable as to a creditor whose claim 25 .198200.1 - 19 -

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1 arose before the transfer was made or the obligation was 2 incurred if the debtor made the transfer or incurred the 3 obligation without receiving a reasonably equivalent value in exchange for the transfer or obligation and the debtor was 4 insolvent at that time or the debtor became insolvent as a 5 result of the transfer or obligation. 6

Β. A transfer made by a debtor is [fraudulent] voidable as to a creditor whose claim arose before the transfer 8 was made if the transfer was made to an insider for an antecedent debt, the debtor was insolvent at that time and the insider had reasonable cause to believe that the debtor was 12 insolvent.

C. Subject to Subsection B of Section 56-10-16 NMSA 1978, a creditor making a claim for relief under Subsection A or B of this section has the burden of proving the elements of the claim for relief by a preponderance of the evidence."

SECTION 14. Section 56-10-20 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1989, Chapter 382, Section 7) is amended to read:

"56-10-20. WHEN TRANSFER IS MADE OR OBLIGATION IS INCURRED.--For the purposes of the Uniform [Fraudulent Transfer] Voidable Transactions Act:

> a transfer is made: Α.

(1) with respect to an asset that is real property other than a fixture, but including the interest of a seller or purchaser under a contract for the sale of the asset, .198200.1 - 20 -

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when the transfer is so far perfected that a good-faith purchaser of the asset from the debtor against [whom] which applicable law permits the transfer to be perfected cannot acquire an interest in the asset that is superior to the interest of the transferee; and

(2) with respect to an asset that is not real property or that is a fixture, when the transfer is so far perfected that a creditor on a simple contract cannot acquire a judicial lien otherwise than under the Uniform [Fraudulent Transfer] Voidable Transactions Act that is superior to the interests of the transferee;

B. if applicable law permits the transfer to be perfected as provided in Subsection A of this section and the transfer is not so perfected before the commencement of an action for relief under the Uniform [Fraudulent Transfer] <u>Voidable Transactions</u> Act, the transfer is deemed made immediately before the commencement of the action;

C. if applicable law does not permit the transfer to be perfected as provided in Subsection A of this section, the transfer is made when it becomes effective between the debtor and the transferee;

D. a transfer is not made until the debtor has acquired rights in the asset transferred; and

E. an obligation is incurred:

(1) if oral, when it becomes effective between.198200.1

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1 the parties; or
