AN ACT

RELATING TO CRIMINAL LAW; EXTENDING THE TIME LIMITATION FOR
PROSECUTING THE CRIMES OF CONSPIRACY AND TAMPERING WITH
EVIDENCE TO COINCIDE WITH THE TIME LIMITATION FOR THE
UNDERLYING CRIME; PROVIDING NO TIME LIMITATION FOR PROSECUTING
A FIRST DEGREE FELONY OR SECOND DEGREE MURDER.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:

SECTION 1. Section 30-1-8 NMSA 1978 (being Laws 1963, Chapter 303, Section 1-8, as amended) is amended to read:

"30-1-8. TIME LIMITATIONS FOR COMMENCING PROSECUTION.--A person shall not be prosecuted, tried or punished in any court of this state unless the indictment is found or information or complaint is filed within the time as provided:

A. for a second degree felony, except for murder in the second degree, within six years from the time the crime was .199433.2

- for a third or fourth degree felony, within five years from the time the crime was committed;
- for a misdemeanor, within two years from the time the crime was committed;
- for a petty misdemeanor, within one year from the time the crime was committed;
- E. for the crime of conspiracy, within the same time period as the highest crime conspired to be committed would be prosecuted;
- F. for the crime of tampering with evidence, within the same time period as the highest crime for which the tampering with evidence was committed would be prosecuted;
- [E.] G. for any crime against or violation of Section 51-1-38 NMSA 1978, within three years from the time the crime was committed;
- [F.] H. for a felony pursuant to Section 7-1-71.3, 7-1-72 or 7-1-73 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was committed; provided that for a series of crimes involving multiple filing periods within one calendar year, the limitation shall begin to run on December 31 of the year in which the crimes occurred;
- [G.] I. for an identity theft crime pursuant to Section 30-16-24.1 NMSA 1978, within five years from the time the crime was discovered;
