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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF NEW MEXICO:
18	SECTION 1. [<u>NEW MATERIAL</u>] CORRECTIONAL OFFICERS1980
19	PRISON RIOTPOSTTRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDERCOMPENSATION
20	APPROPRIATION
21	A. A correctional officer who was employed and
22	physically present at the penitentiary of New Mexico during the
23	riot that occurred from February 2 to February 4, 1980, or, if
24	deceased, the deceased's personal representative or other
25	appropriate person as determined by the secretary of
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1 corrections, and who has been or was diagnosed with 2 posttraumatic stress disorder resulting from the officer's 3 involvement in and experience during the riot, may be entitled to compensation as provided in this section. 4 Β. The corrections department shall: 5 identify surviving correctional officers, 6 (1)7 or, if any are deceased, the deceased's personal representative or other appropriate person as determined by the secretary of 8 9 corrections, who were physically present at the penitentiary of New Mexico at the beginning of the riot and who were involved 10 in and experienced any aspect of the riot; 11 12 (2) provide those correctional officers identified or personal representatives or other appropriate 13 persons with notice of their potential eligibility for 14 compensation as provided in this section; and 15 create an application process and form 16 (3) that shall: 17 require information necessary to (a) 18 19 establish the correctional officer's identity and the officer's 20 presence at the penitentiary of New Mexico during the riot; (b) provide details of any compensation 21 that the correctional officer or the officer's estate received 22 from the officer's involvement in and experience during the 23 riot; 24 require a certified diagnosis from 25 (c) .199770.1

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1 an appropriate licensed health care provider that the 2 correctional officer is currently suffering from or suffered from posttraumatic stress disorder as a result of the officer's 3 4 involvement and experience during the riot; (d) set a reasonable deadline, but no 5 later than December 31, 2015, for a correctional officer or 6 7 other person receiving notice of potential eligibility for compensation to submit an application to the secretary of 8 9 corrections for compensation pursuant to this section; (e) establish a method of independent 10 review of the posttraumatic stress disorder diagnosis to 11 12 confirm eligibility for compensation; require a waiver and release from (f) 13 further claims against the state for a correctional officer's 14 involvement in and experience during the riot if the 15 correctional officer or other person receives compensation 16 pursuant to this section; and 17 (g) provide for an informal hearing at 18 19 which a correctional officer applicant, a personal 20 representative or other appropriate person may be represented by counsel or other person of the applicant's choice if the 21 secretary of corrections decides that more information from the 22 applicant is needed before the secretary can make a decision on 23 the application. 24 If the secretary of corrections decides that the C. 25

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1 diagnosis submitted with the application substantiates that the 2 correctional officer is currently suffering from or suffered 3 from posttraumatic stress disorder resulting from the officer's involvement in and experience during the riot and that the 4 5 application is appropriate in all other respects, the secretary shall pay to the correctional officer, a personal 6 7 representative or other appropriate person one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000); provided that if the correctional officer 8 9 or the officer's estate received any compensation for the officer's involvement in and experience during the riot, the 10 payment amount shall be reduced to the difference between the 11 12 amount that the officer previously received and one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), but if the previous compensation 13 14 was greater than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000), no payment shall be made. 15

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION.--One million five hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000) is appropriated from the general fund to the corrections department for expenditure in fiscal year 2016 to carry out the purposes of Section 1 of this act; provided that no more than one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall be used for administration. Any unexpended or unencumbered balance remaining at the end of fiscal year 2016 shall revert to the general fund.

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
